VACATION OF ZELENY THIRD SUBDIVISION

Landowner Diane Zeleny requested that the Zeleny Third Subdivision be vacated due to the submission of Zeleny Fourth Subdivision. Zoning Administrator Shaundee Graham presented the recommendation from the Planning Commission to the Board also requesting the vacation of Zeleny Third Subdivision.

Sluka moved and Graham seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION #2024 - 22

A RESOLUTION TO VACATE ZELENY THIRD SUBDIVISION 3.317 ACRES LOCATED ON PART OF THE SOUTH HALF OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 24, TOWNSHIP 7 NORTH, RANGE 2 WEST OF THE SIXTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA.

WHEREAS, Surveyor Chris Witulski on behalf of Zeleny Family Trust, % Diane Zeleny, Trustee, owner of: Zeleny Third Subdivision of 3.317 acres located on part of the South half of the Northeast Quarter of Section, 24, Township 7N, Range 2W, of the 6th Principal, Meridian, Fillmore County, Nebraska, being hereinafter referred to as the "described property".

Have filed to vacate The Zeleny Third Subdivision with the Fillmore County Zoning Administrator and Fillmore County Clerk, and

WHEREAS, the duly appointed Planning Commission of Fillmore County, Nebraska has prepared amendments, held the required meeting on the 21st day of October 2024 with proper notice given, and has given a recommendation to Vacate the Zeleny Third Subdivision. This Board finds:

- 1. The property described is situated in the Agriculture (AG) Zoning District of Fillmore County, Nebraska with a legal plat of record.
- 2. The proposed vacation, of the entire subdivision, fulfills Fillmore County's Subdivision Resolution requirements for a vacation of subdivisions as specifically allowed under Section 504, 504.01, 504.02 together with other provisions applicable thereto.
