Reorganization Meeting

The public meetings guidelines are posted as required by law and available for public distribution is requested. The reorganization meeting adjourned at 9:35 a.m.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The County Clerk, acted as temporary Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2008. Simacek nominated Mueller, Galusha seconded, and Kimbrough nominated Yates, Mueller seconded.

Cerny moved and Capek seconded the motion that the nominations cease and a ballot be cast. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

NAMING OFFICIAL BANK DEPOSITORIES

Simacek moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2008-01

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the First National Bank of Exeter, the Farmers State Bank of Fairmont, the Geneva State Bank of Geneva, Shickley, and Grafton, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, and the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan, are here by designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.

DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

RESOLUTION 2008-3

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capitol stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2008, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$100,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Insurance Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENT SUPPLEMENT NUMBER THREE AND SITE LEASE AMENDMENT NUMBER THREE BETWEEN THE COUNTY AND FILLMORE COUNTY LEASING CORPORATION WITH RESPECT TO REFUNDING FILLMORE COUNTY LEASING CORPORATION (A) LEASE RENTAL REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 1998 (FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA HOSPITAL PROJECT) DATED MAY 1, 1998 AND (B) LEASE RENTAL REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2005A (FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA HOSPITAL PROJECT) DATED JUNE 17, 2005; APPROVING THE ISSUANCE BY THE CORPORATION OF NOT TO EXCEED ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,350,000) IN PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ITS LEASE RENTAL REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2008 (FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA HOSPITAL PROJECT); DELEGATING, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF FILLMORE COUNTY HOSPITAL TO EXERCISE HIS INDEPENDENT JUDGEMENT AND ABSOLUTE DISCRETION IN APPROVING THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT, RATES OF INTEREST AND THE OTHER TERMS AND PROVISIONS WITH RESPECT TO SUCH BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE TIME WHEN THIS RESOLUTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT; AND RELATED MATTERS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "County") hereby find and determine as follows:

- (a) The County is authorized pursuant to Section 23-3114, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Act"), to enter into contracts for the lease of real or personal property for any purpose for which the County is authorized by law to purchase property or construct improvements, which contracts are not restricted to a single year, and may provide for the purchase of the property in installment payments.
- (b) The Fillmore County Leasing Corporation (the "Corporation") is a nonprofit corporation duly organized and existing under the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act, Chapter 21, Article 19, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Nonprofit Corporation Act"), for the purpose of acquiring property of any kind and nature, usable or useful to the County in performing its governmental functions and leasing the same to the County.
- (c) Pursuant to the provisions of the Act, to maintain and preserve the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County, the County has previously entered into (1) a Lease-Purchase Agreement, dated as of May 1, 2998 (the "1998 Lease Agreement"), with the Corporation to pay the costs of acquiring, constructing, equipping and furnishing an addition and other improvements to Fillmore County Hospital (the "Hospital") use of the Hospital (collectively, the "1998 Project"), (2) Lease-Purchase Agreement Supplement and Amendment Number One, dated June 17, 2005 ("Lease Supplement No. 1"), with the Corporation to pay a portion of the costs of acquiring, constructing, equipping and furnishing an addition and other improvements to Fillmore County Hospital (collectively, the "2005 Project"), and (3) Lease-Purchase Agreement Supplement and Amendment Number Two, dated November 29, 2005 ("Lease Supplement No. 2"), with the Corporation to pay

- the remaining costs of the 2005 Project. The 1998 Lease Agreement, as amended and supplemented from time to time, including, without limitation, Lease Supplement No. 1 and Lease Supplement No. 2, is referred to as the "Lease Agreement."
- (d) In connection with the execution and delivery of the 1998 Agreement, the Lease-Purchase Supplement No. 1 and the Lease-Purchase Supplement No. 2, pursuant to (1) a Trust Indenture, dated as of May 1, 1998 (the "1998 Indenture"), between the Corporation and Geneva State Bank, as trustee (the "Trustee"), the Corporation issued \$1,965,000 principal amount of its Lease Rental Revenue Bonds, Series 1998 (Fillmore County, Nebraska Hospital Project), dated May 1, 1998 (the "1998 Bonds"), to finance the costs of the 1998 Project, (2) Trust Indenture Supplement Number One, dated June 17, 2005 ("Indenture Supplement No. 1"), the Corporation issued \$760,000 principal amount of its Lease Rental Revenue Bonds, Series 2005A (Fillmore County, Nebraska Hospital Project), dated June 17, 2005 (the "2005A Bonds"), to finance a portion of the costs of the 2005 Project, and (3) Trust Indenture Supplement Number Two, dated November 29, 2005 ("Indenture Supplement No. 2"), the Corporation issued \$240,000 principal amount of its Lease Rental Revenue Bonds, Series 2005B (Fillmore County, Nebraska Hospital Project), dated November 29, 2005 (the "2005B Bonds"), to finance the remaining costs of the 2005 Project. The 1998 Indenture, as amended and supplemented from time to time, including, without limitation, Indenture Supplement No. 1 and Indenture Supplement No. 2, is referred to as the "Indenture."
- (e) All of the outstanding 1998 Bonds and 2005A Bonds (the "**Refunded Bonds**") remain unpaid and are a legal liability against the Corporation, provision for the payment of all or any part of which may be made by the lawful issuance and sale of refunding bonds of the Corporation pursuant to the Nonprofit Corporation Act.
- (f) Since the issuance of the Refunded Bonds, the rates of interest available in the markets have declined so that the Corporation can effect a savings in interest costs by providing for payment and redemption of all or part of the Refunded Bonds, through the issuance of refunding bonds of the Corporation, and the County can effect a reduction in its rental payments under the Lease Agreement.
- (g) The County has on hand no debt service or other sinking fund money for the payment of rentals under the Lease Agreement sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the Refunded outstanding 1998 Bonds and 2005A Bonds.
- (h) The County has carefully considered the options available to it with respect to refunding the outstanding 1998 Bonds and the 2005A Bonds and has determined that the issuance by the Corporation of its Lease Rental Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2008 (Fillmore County, Nebraska Hospital Project) (the "2008 Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed One Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,350,000), is necessary, desirable, advisable and in the best interests of the County and is hereby accepted and approved by the County.
- (i) The County will have a beneficial interest in the Corporation and will have exclusive beneficial possession and use of the Project while the 2008 Bonds remain outstanding and the County will obtain full legal title to the Project upon the payment in full of the 2008 Bonds.
- **Section 2.** The Lease-Purchase Agreement Supplement Number Three, dated the date of the execution and delivery thereof ("**Lease Supplement No. 3**"), amending and supplementing the Lease Agreement is substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and made a part hereof by reference, is hereby approved. The Chair, upon advice of the County Attorney and bond counsel, is hereby authorized to make such changes, additions or deletions with respect to Lease Supplement No. 3 as may be in the best interests of the County and the Corporation to provide for the payment and redemption of the Refund Bonds prior to the signing thereof.
- Section 3. The Site Lease Amendment Number Three, dated the date of the execution and delivery thereof ("Site Lease Amendment No. 3"), amending and supplementing the Site Lease, dated as of May 1, 1998 (the "1998 Site Lease") (the 1998 Site Lease, as amended and supplemented from time to time, including, but not limited to Site Lease Amendment No. 3 and all other supplements or amendments thereto are collectively referred as the "Site Lease"), between the County and the Corporation with respect to the real estate upon which the 1998 Project and the 2005 Project are located, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B and made a part hereof by reference, is hereby approved. The Chair, upon advice of the County Attorney and bond counsel, is hereby authorized to make such changes, additions, or deletions with respect to the Site Lease as may be in the best interest of the County and the Corporation to carry out the 2008 Project prior to the signing thereof.
- Section 4. The issuance, sale and delivery by the Corporation of its Lease Rental Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2008 (Fillmore County, Nebraska Hospital Project) dated the date of delivery thereof and payment therefore (the "2008 Bonds") in a principal amount not to exceed \$1,350,000 to provide funds to provide for the payment and redemption of the Refunded Bonds, the terms of which are set forth in Indenture Supplement Number Three, dated the date of the execution and delivery thereof (Indenture Supplement No. 3"), between the Corporation and the Trustee, amending and supplementing the Indenture, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C and made a part hereof by reference, is hereby approved. The sale of the 2008 Bonds to D. A. Davidson pursuant to a Bond Purchase Agreement (the "Purchase Agreement") at a price not less than 98.5% of the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest, if any, to the day of delivery, is hereby approved.
- **Section 5.** The 2008 Bonds shall be issued in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,350,000 and shall bear interest at an interest rate not to exceed five percent per annum (5.00%). The Chief Executive Officer of the Hospital is hereby authorized and directed to approve the principal amount of 2008 Bonds to be issued and the principal maturities, interest rates and redemption provisions thereof and to take all necessary actions and execute all necessary documents to effect the sale of the 2008 Bonds.

Section 6. The County makes the following representations in connection with the exception for small governmental units from the arbitrage rebate requirements under Section 148(f)(4)(C) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"):

- (a) the Corporation is issuing the 2008 Bonds on behalf of the County pursuant to Revenue Procedure 82-26:
- (b) the County has general taxing powers;
- (c) 95% or more of the net proceeds of the 2008 Bonds are to be used for local governmental activities of the County; and
- (d) The aggregate face amount of all tax-exempt bonds (other than private activity bonds) to be issued by the Corporation, the County and all entities subordinate to the County during calendar year 2008, including the Bonds, is not reasonably expected to exceed \$5,000,000.

Pursuant to Section 148(f)(4)(C)(iv) of the Code, the County hereby allocates up to \$1,350,000 of its \$5,000,000 limitation for calendar year 2008 to the Corporation.

- **Section 7.** The County hereby acknowledges that the Corporation has designated the 2008 Bonds to be "qualified tax-exempt obligations" as such terms is defined in Section 265(b)(3) of the Code. The County hereby represents that:
 - (a) the reasonably anticipated amount of tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds) which will be issued by or on behalf of the County and all entities subordinate to the County during calendar year 2008 does not exceed \$10,000,000; and
 - (b) the aggregate principal amount of obligations designated by the County as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" during calendar year 2008, including the 2008 Bonds, does not exceed \$10,000,000.

The Chair is hereby authorized to take such other action as may be necessary to make effective the designation in this **Section 7**.

- **Section 8.** The County will accept from the Corporation conveyance of unencumbered fee title to the 1998 Project and the 2005 Project after all the 2008 Bonds have been paid or payment therefore has been provided for in accordance with the herein approved Indenture.
- **Section 9.** The Chair, Clerk, Deputy Clerk, Treasurer, Deputy Treasurer, County Attorney, any Deputy County Attorney and the Chief Executive Office of the Hospital are hereby authorized to execute and deliver for and on behalf of the County all additional certificates, documents, opinions or other papers and to perform all other acts as they may deem necessary or appropriate in order to implement and carry out the matters herein authorized, including, without limitation, the issuance of the 2008 Bonds and to call for redemption of the Refunded Bonds.
- **Section 10.** All resolutions, orders or ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are to the extent of such conflict or conflicts, hereby repealed.
- **Section 11.** This resolution shall take effect and be in full force after its passage and adoption as provided by law.

RURAL APPREHENSION PROGRAM

After discussion, Kimbrough moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2008-42

WHEREAS, law enforcement agencies with the following counties: Butler, Fillmore, Hamilton, Jefferson, Merrick, Polk, Saunders, Seward, Thayer, Webster, and York desire to enter into a cooperative law enforcement effort; and

WHEREAS, the above agencies have submitted a grant application known as the RURAL APREHENSION PROGRAM (hereafter RAP 19 #08-MI-802); and

WHEREAS, the RAP project has been funded by the Nebraska Crime Commission; and

WHEREAS, the various counties, communities, and agencies within those jurisdictions desire to make the most efficient use of the power by enabling them to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities in a manner pursuant to forms of governmental organization that will accord best with geographic, economic, population, and other factors; and

WHEREAS, an interlocal agreement, consistent with Nebraska Revised Statutes 13-801 et.seq, would be in the best interest of all participating agencies; and

WHEREAS, the agencies desire to enter into a written interlocal agreement for the purposes of carrying out the Rap objectives and grant requirements of the Nebraska Crime Commission.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors authorizes William L. Burgess to enter the County of Fillmore into an interlocal agreement for joint and cooperative action pursuant to the provisions of Section 13-801 through 13-807 of Nebraska Revised Statutes. The interlocal agreement shall be for the strict administration of the RAP project and all funds allocated by the Nebraska Crime Commission, and Match dollars allocated by the RAP members. Further, this interlocal agreement shall not establish a separate legal entity, rather as a joint and cooperative undertaking between public agencies i.e. state, county, city, and village. (Nebraska Revised Statute 13-801).

Amount of match dollars allocated by the County of Fillmore for the 2008-2009 grant period (RAP 19) will be \$3,317.00. (2000 census 6,634 x \$0.50).

VACATION OF COUNTY ROAD "B"

RESOLUTION 2008-44

WHEREAS, pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1722, the County Board of Fillmore County, Nebraska, may, by resolution when it deems the public interest may require vacation or abandonment of a public road of the County, and may direct the County Highway Superintendent to study the use being made of such public road and to submit in writing to the County Board his recommendation as to the vacation or abandonment thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, directed the above referenced study to be made and such study was made with regard to inside Section Nine (9), Township eight (8) North, Range three (3) West of the 6th P.M. in Fillmore County, Nebraska, and directed that the County Highway Superintendent submit in writing to the County Board within thirty days, a report upon the study made and his recommendation as to the vacation or abandonment thereof and directed that such report be retained in the office of the County Clerk of Fillmore County, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1724, has the authority to adopt a resolution fixing the time, date, and place for a public hearing upon receipt of the above referenced study and publish such resolution once a week for three consecutive weeks in a legal newspaper published in the County and cause copies to be served by registered or certified mail upon the owners of land abutting on or adjacent to the road to be vacated or abandoned by mailing the same to the last known address of each owner not less than two weeks in advance of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, adopted the above referenced Resolution and complied with Nebraska Revised Statutes §39-1722 and §39-1724.

WHEREAS, Fillmore County has offered to relinquish the above referenced road to the West Blue Township by written notification to said Township on July 22, 2008 and that four (4) months have elapsed since said notification and that the notified township has not filed a petition indicating its desire to maintain such road

pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1726 and has in fact conveyed to the Board its approval of such vacation of roadway.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fillmore, have by a vote of two-thirds of more voted to vacate the inside roadway running east and west in direction through the center of Section nine (9), Township eight (8) North, Range three (3) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Fillmore County, Nebraska.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, upon a vote of at least two-thirds of all members, deems that the public interest and public good, require the abandonment of the above referenced roadway and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fillmore County Board does hereby vacate the inside roadway running east and west in direction through the center of Section nine (9), Township eight (8) North, Range three (3) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Fillmore County, Nebraska, and that the ownership of the vacated portion of the inside roadway of said Section nine (9) is hereby awarded and does hereby revert to the following persons:

- 1. The South half of said vacated roadway abutting the Southwest Quarter (SW 1/4) of Section Nine (9) and the bridge presently located on the vacated roadway shall become the sole and separate property of William Softley.
- 2. The North half of said vacated roadway abutting the Northwest Quarter (NW 1/4) of Section Nine (9) and the bridge presently located on the vacated roadway shall become the sole and separate property of Audrun Siebert.
- 3. The South half of said vacated roadway abutting the Southwest Quarter (SE ¼) of Section Nine (9) shall become the sole and separate property of Lauber Seed Company.
- 4. The North half of said vacated roadway abutting the Southeast Quarter (SE 1/4) of Section Nine (9) shall become the sole and separate property of Lauber Seed Company.

That the owners of said vacated roadway are being awarded the portions of the vacated road upon the following conditions:

- 1. The ownership of the bridge that is presently located on the West One-half of the vacated roadway which is presently located in Section Nine (9) is hereby awarded to and shall become the sole and separate property of the adjacent landowners, to-wit: the North half of said bridge is hereby awarded and shall become the sole and separate property of Audrun Siebert and the South half of said bridge is hereby awarded and shall become the sole and separate property of William Softley. Said owners of the bridge shall be responsible for the repair, upkeep and/or removal of said bridge, all pilings and bridge abutments for said bridge.
- 2. If the respective landowners are desirous of determining the exact center of the vacated road or the portion of the vacated road which each shall own following the vacation of said, then it shall be the responsibility and expense of the four landowners to conduct a survey in order to resolve that issue.
- 3. It shall be the sole responsibility of the respective landowners to construct and maintain a barricade at the east and west ends of the vacated roadway in order to prevent usage roadway by any person other than the record owners of the vacated roadway and their guests.
- 4. It shall be the sole responsibility of the respective landowners heretofore described to notify their liability insurance carriers of their acquisition of the vacated portion of the roadway so as to provide said insurance carriers with knowledge that said vacated roadway is now owned by the respective owners for purposes of liability insurance coverage.
- 5. The County will have no liability or responsibility in regard to the bridge that is being awarded to the adjacent land owners, to-wit; Aubrun Siebert and William Softley.
