Reorganization Meeting

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The County Clerk, acting as temporary Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2010. Simacek nominated Capek and Kimbrough seconded the nomination and Galusha requested that nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast.

The temporary Chairman declared Capek to be the Board Chairman for the year 2010 and Capek assumed the chair.

The Chairman declared that Cerny would be Vice-Chairman of the Board for 2010.

NAMING OFFICIAL BANK DEPOSITORIES

Yates moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2010-01

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the First National Bank of Exeter, the Farmers State Bank of Fairmont, the Geneva State Bank of Geneva, Shickley, and Grafton, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, and the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan, are hereby designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be authorized to invest the surplus funds of said county in United States Government Bonds, United States Treasury Notes, Bills or Certificates of Indebtedness maturing within two years of the date of purchase; and in Certificates of Deposit, or Money Market Savings Accounts.

DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

RESOLUTION 2010-3

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capital stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2010, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$100,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

MIGRATORY BIRD ACT PLAN OF ACTION

After discussion, Mueller moved and Simacek seconded the motion to approve the following Migratory Bird Act Plan of Action:

Fillmore County has set a "Plan of Action" in effect to meet policies and laws that are required under the Migratory Bird Act.

The State of Nebraska Department of Roads will, to the extent practicable, schedule the letting of projects such that clearing and grubbing can occur outside of the primary nesting season in Nebraska which has been determined to generally occur between April 1 and September 1. Work on structures, such as but not limited to bridges and culverts, should occur outside the primary swallow nesting season, April 15 to September 30, unless approved methods of avoiding nesting have been taken on the structure. The nesting dates above are a guide only, nesting can occur outside of these dates. Work outside of these dates is not exempt from compliance with the Migratory Bird Treaty Act.

If Fillmore County has a road improvement construction project that will be constructed during the time periods listed above, the following procedures will be followed;

If a Contactor is under contract, the following guidance is provided for compliance with the Migratory Bird Treaty Act for construction of NDOR projects:

The Contractor shall, to the extent possible, schedule work on structures, such as but not limited to bridges and culverts, and clearing and grubbing activities to occur outside the primary nesting season in Nebraska. However, if circumstances dictate that project construction or demolition must be done when nesting migratory birds may be present, a survey of the number of active nests and species of birds shall be conducted by qualified personnel representing the Contractor, the LPA's Responsible Charge Person and assisted by the Project Manager (PM), NDOR Environmental Section staff, or the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) - Wildlife Services Office.

- 1. The Contractor shall submit a plan to the NDOR through the LPA's Responsible Charge Person regarding how he/she intends to accomplish bridge demolition or clearing and grubbing of the project to avoid conflict with nesting migratory birds.
- 2. The Contractor must submit to the NDOR through the LPA's Responsible Charge Person a temporary erosion control plan tailored to fit the plan for clearing and grubbing.
- 3. If construction operations result in unavoidable conflict with nesting migratory bird's eggs or young, which will result in "taking" (destroying active bird nests) nests and their contents, the Contractor should notify the LPA's Responsible Charge Person and the LPA's Responsible Charge Person will then contact the NDOR Project Manager (PM). The PM shall notify the Environmental Section of Planning and Project Development by telephone at 402-479-4766.

- 4. The NDOR Environmental Section will then determine if assistance in conducting the survey will be provided by the NDOR Environmental Section (if available) or from the USDA APHIS Wildlife Services Office and arrange for assistance with the survey of nest numbers, bird species, etc. Results of the survey shall be maintained by the NDOR until project completion.
- 5. If the nesting survey is required, and the project was awarded prior to the nesting season, and the Contractor did not accomplish clearing/grubbing outside the nesting season, the Contractor will reimburse the Department of Roads for each survey required at \$1,000 per survey. If the project was awarded during the nesting season, and construction activities are such that clearing/grubbing must be accomplished prior to any other activity on the project, then there will be no charge assessed for the initial survey. The Contractor is responsible for removing all trees surveyed, without active nests, within 5 days of the survey. Reimbursement for additional surveys may be charged if the Contractor fails to remove the trees within 5 days of the survey, and requires an additional survey. Survey reimbursement will be determined on a project specific basis, considering the project timeline and associated activities.
- 6. If an active nest is found during the survey, the Contractor should do everything possible to restructure his activities and leave the nest undisturbed until the young fledge (leave the nest and are no longer dependent on their parents or the nest). Fledging could occur within a week, or up to a month, after the survey depending on the species of bird and whether the nest contained eggs or young. Also depending on the species of bird and their sensitivity to disturbance, a buffer of up to 30 feet surrounding the tree with the active nest could be required by U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.
- 7. If construction cannot be restructured to allow the birds to fledge, and it is determined as an unavoidable "take" circumstance, the NDOR Environmental Section and USDA APHIS Wildlife Services will document when the project let, when construction began, any circumstances that caused the project to be delayed, all efforts made by NDOR and the Contractor to avoid clearing during the nesting season, and impacts to NDOR, the Contractor and the traveling public if the project is delayed to allow fledging of the nest. This information will be presented to U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's Law Enforcement Office in Nebraska for review and determination if "taking" the nest will be prosecuted under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. If prosecution is avoided, then USDA APHIS Wildlife Services, NDOR Environmental Section, the LPA's Responsible Charge Person or the PM will need to be on site when the nest is removed to properly and humanely dispose of the contents of the nest, and document its destruction.
- 8. It is the Contractors' responsibility to schedule his work to accommodate the process of conducting a survey(s) and submitting the necessary documentation if avoidance is not practicable. The Contractor shall be responsible for using any legal and practical method to prevent the nesting of birds in order to prevent the need for any survey and prevent the need for additional surveys. It is understood and agreed that the Contractor has considered in the bid all of the pertinent requirements concerning migratory birds (including endangered species) and that no additional compensation, other than time extensions if warranted, will be allowed for any delays or inconvenience resulting in these requirements.
- If a Contactor is not under contract, Fillmore County will use the following guidance for compliance with the Migratory Bird Treaty Act for construction of the NDOR project and will continue to do so until a Notice to Proceed is received from the State of Nebraska Department of Roads informing Fillmore County they can proceed with construction activities:
- 1. Prior to April 1st, Fillmore County will inspect all trees, bushes and drainage structures in the construction footprint area for active bird nest. If active nests are found, Fillmore County will notify the NDOR Project Manager (PM). The PM shall notify the Environmental Section of Planning and Project Development by telephone at 402-479-4766. All inactive nest will be removed from the construction site.
- 2. Prior to April 1st, if no active nests are found, Fillmore County will perform the cutting of trees 4 feet above ground level and removing brush from the project where birds may build nest. The remaining clearing and grubbing phase of the project can be finished by the Contractor after the Contractor has an executed Contract and Notice to Proceed from NDOR.
- 3. Prior to April 1st, if no active nests are located in the structures in the project foot print area, Fillmore County will remove all inactive nest. Fillmore County will place bird netting under any structure that is scheduled to be demolished and replaced.
- 4. Fillmore County will continue to monitor all structures in the construction foot print area for freshly built bird nest and remove them until the responsibilities of the Migratory Bird Act and the requirements by the State of Nebraska can be turned over to the contractor.
- 5. If a CE Consultant is not under contract, Fillmore County's RC Person will enter notes into the Site Manager Program in regards to the required record keeping and documentation of activities on the construction project during this phase of the project.
- 6. Fillmore County will work closely with the appointed State of Nebraska Project Manager for the project so all requirements and laws are met.

The Assessor and Appraiser feel using only Fillmore County sales the median should be 72% but due to the Property Tax Administrator using sales from other counties it dropped the median to 70%. After discussion, the Board requested that the County Assessor and Appraiser attend the County's Equalization hearing and discuss where the Property Tax division came up with the borrowing of sales from surrounding counties.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Geraldine Daniels, Planning & Zoning Administrator requested that she be allowed to work eight hours extra a week to work on the maps for the Comprehensive plan update. After discussion, the Board approved her to work the extra hours for about two months.

CASA BUDGET REQUEST

Budget request for fiscal year 2010/2011 is \$8,770.00 which is \$1,230.00 less than 2009/2010 fiscal year. Budget request will be taken into consideration during the budget process later this summer.

VACATION OF A PORTION OF ROAD 23

After discussion, Mueller moved and Cerny seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2010-18

WHEREAS, pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1722, the County Board of Fillmore County, Nebraska, may, by resolution when it deems the public interest may require vacation or abandonment of a public road of the County, and may direct the County Highway Superintendent to study the use being made of such public road and to submit in writing to the County Board his recommendation as to the vacation or abandonment thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, directed the above referenced study to be made and such study was made with regard to a section of public roadway between Section Twenty Two (22) and Section Twenty Three (23), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the 6th P.M. in Fillmore County, Nebraska, and directed that the County Highway Superintendent submit in writing to the County Board within thirty days, a report upon the study made and his recommendation as to the vacation or abandonment thereof and directed that such report be retained in the office of the County Clerk of Fillmore County, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1724, has the authority to adopt a resolution fixing the time, date and place for a public hearing upon receipt of the above referenced study and publish such resolution once a week for three consecutive weeks in a legal newspaper published in the County and cause copies to be served by registered or certified mail upon the owners of land abutting on or adjacent to the road to be vacated or abandoned by mailing the same to the last known address of each owner not less than two weeks in advance of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, adopted the above referenced Resolution and complied with Nebraska Revised Statutes §39-1722 and §39-1724.

WHEREAS, Fillmore County has offered to relinquish the above referenced road to the Liberty Township by written notification to said Township on <u>April 29, 2010</u> and that on <u>May 3, 2010</u> conveyed to the Board its approval of such vacation of roadway.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fillmore, have by a vote of two-thirds of more voted to vacate a certain portion of County Roadway described as follows: Referring to the Southeast corner marker of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Fillmore County, Nebraska; thence North, along the East line of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, a distance of approximately 2,112 feet to the point of beginning; thence West, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet; thence North, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 450 feet; thence East, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 66 feet; thence South, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 450 feet; thence West, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet to the point of beginning, containing approximately 0.68 acres.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, upon a vote of at least two-thirds of all members, deems that the public interest and public good, require the abandonment of the above referenced roadway and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fillmore County Board does hereby vacate a certain portion of County Roadway described as follows: Referring to the Southeast corner marker of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Fillmore County, Nebraska; thence North, along the East line of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, a distance of approximately 2,112 feet to the point of beginning; thence West, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet; thence North, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 450 feet; thence East, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 66 feet; thence South, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 450 feet; thence West, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet to the point of beginning, containing approximately 0.68 acres is hereby awarded and does hereby revert to the following persons:

1. A certain parcel of land described as follows: Referring to the Southeast corner marker of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Fillmore County, Nebraska; thence North, along the East line of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, a distance of approximately 2,112 feet to the point of beginning; thence

West, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet; thence North, a distance of approximately 450 feet; thence East, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet; thence South, along the East side of section twenty two (22), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian a distance of approximately 450 feet; to the point of beginning, containing approximately 0.34 acres located on the vacated roadway shall become the sole and separate property of Karen J. A certain parcel of land described as follows: Referring to the Southwest corner marker of section twenty three (23), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Fillmore County, Nebraska; thence North, along the West line of section twenty three (23), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, a distance of approximately 2,112 feet to the point of beginning; thence East, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet; thence North, a distance of approximately 450 feet; thence West, perpendicular, a distance of approximately 33 feet; thence South, along the West side of section twenty three (23), Township Seven (7) North, Range One (1) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian a distance of approximately 450 feet; to the point of beginning, containing approximately 0.34 acres on the vacated roadway shall become the sole and separate property of Delmar J. & Marjorie L. Kuska.

That the owners of said vacated roadway are being awarded the portions or the vacated road upon the following conditions:

- 1. Fillmore County is allowing the Lower Big Blue Natural Resources District to remove the bridge and the traveled roadway section to be used as borrow in constructing a watershed project on Turkey Creek, called Dam Site 3 that will eventually back up water to overtop the roadway between section 22 and section 23, T-7-N, R-1-W in Fillmore County.
- 2. If the respective landowners are desirous of determining the exact center of the vacated road or the portion of the vacated road which each shall own following the vacation of said, then it shall be the responsibility and expense of the four landowners to conduct a survey in order to resolve the issue
- 3. It shall be the sole responsibility or the respective landowners heretofore described to notify their liability insurance carriers of the acquisition of the vacated portion of the roadway so as to provide said insurance carriers with knowledge that said vacated roadway is now owned by the respective owners for purposes of liability insurance coverage.
- 4. The County shall have no responsibility or liability with regard to the maintenance of the vacated roadway.

PIVOT AND END GUNS DAMAGING ROADS

Deputy County Attorney, Howard Ach presented a resolution and a new public notice for the newspaper regarding the policy for pivot and end guns damaging roadways.

After discussion, Cerny moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2010-19

WHEREAS, Section 39-301 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes prohibits anyone from injuring or obstructing a public road, and

WHEREAS, diverting water unto or across a public road which saturates, washes, or impairs the maintenance, construction or passability of such public road is prohibited by law, and

WHEREAS, allowing water to accumulate on the roadway or traveled surface of the road is prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, no criminal penalties may be applied when damages to a road has been caused by the mechanical malfunction of any irrigation equipment when a sprinkler system had been set so that under normal weather conditions no water would have been placed upon the right of way of any road, and

WHEREAS, all sprinkler systems which due to location or design diverts, or is capable of diverting, water onto or across a public road so as to saturate, wash, or impair the maintenance, construction or passability of such road, or allows water to accumulate on the roadway or traveled surface shall be equipped with a devise to automatically shut off the end gun of the irrigation system, and

WHEREAS, it is the determination of the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska that any person who damages a road with irrigation water in violation of Nebraska Revised Statutes 39-301, shall be liable to the County for the cost of repair, re-graveling and/or additional maintenance caused, and

WHEREAS, the owner of record of the land on which the irrigation system caused the damage should be required to reimburse the county for said damages.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County of Fillmore that the owner of record of land on which is located any irrigation system which damages a public road in Fillmore County, Nebraska, shall be liable

for the cost of repair, re-graveling and additional maintenance, caused by said irrigation system diverting irrigation water onto or across a public road which saturates, washes, or impairs the maintenance, construction, or passability of such road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fillmore County Road Department is authorized, after given reasonable notice to owners of the obstruction or persons so obstructing such road, to forthwith repair, re-gravel and maintain all such damaged road and bill the cost thereof to the owner of record of the land on which is located said irrigation system.

RESOLUTION 2010-22

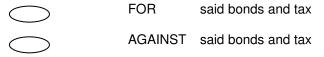
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors (the "**Board**") of The County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "**County**") hereby finds and determines that: (a) it is necessary, desirable, advisable and in the best interests of the County and its residents that funds be provided for the purpose of paying the costs of acquiring, constructing, equipping and furnishing a replacement hospital to be owned by the County and operated by a board of trustees pursuant to Sections 23-3501 to 23-3527, inclusive, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, and; (b) for such purposes it will be necessary to issue bonds of the County in the total principal amount of not to exceed <u>Eighteen Million Dollars</u> (\$18,000,000.00); and (c) a proposition for the issuance of bonds for such purposes has not been submitted to the electors of this County within six months preceding the date preceding the date of the special election called by this Resolution.

Section 2. By Resolution of the Board, it is hereby ordered that a special election be held in the County on August 10, 2010, at which special election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the County the following proposition:

"Shall The County of Fillmore, Nebraska issue bonds of the County in a principal amount not to exceed Eighteen Million Dollars (\$18,000,000.00) for the purpose of paying the costs of acquiring, constructing, equipping and furnishing a replacement hospital to be owned by the County and operated by a board of trustees pursuant to Sections 23-3501 to 23-3527, inclusive, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended; said bonds to be issued from time to time as may be determined by the Board of Supervisors, to bear interest at a rate or rates to be determined by the Board of Supervisors and to become due at such time or times as may be fixed by the Board of Supervisors; provided, however, any or all said bonds shall be redeemable at the option of the County as provided by law at the time of issuance; and

"Shall the County cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in said County in an amount sufficient in rate and amount to pay the interest and principal of said bonds as the same become due to the extent hospital revenues are insufficient for such purposes?"



Section 3. Qualified electors voting in favor of the proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "FOR said Bonds and tax" following said proposition, and qualified electors voting against said proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "AGAINST said Bonds and tax" following said proposition.

Section 4. The polling places for said election shall be designated by the Election Commissioner of the County. The polls shall be kept open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on August 10, 2010, and a copy of the question submitted shall be posted at each place of voting during the day of election. The election boards and counting boards shall be appointed by the Election Commissioner of the County for this purpose.

Section 5. The Clerk is authorized and directed to make all necessary arrangements for submitting said proposition at said special election and to cause ballots to be printed containing said proposition set out at length and furnish the same, together with all necessary election supplies, to the election boards. The form of Notice to be published and the form of ballot to be used as such election are hereby approved as presented to the Board and a copy of said form of Notice and said form of ballot are attached to this resolution and made apart hereof.

Section 6. General notice of such election shall be published in the <u>Nebraska Signal</u>, as designated by the Board and posted by the County Clerk not less than forty (40) days prior to such election. Notice of the submission of said proposition shall be given to the qualified electors of the County by publication for four (4) weeks, five (5) times in the <u>Nebraska Signal</u>, a newspaper of general circulation in said County, the first publication to be on July 7, 2010 and the last publication on August 4, 2010, The sample ballot shall be published as provided by law.

WHEREAS, by participation in said Emergency Management and Homeland Security Programs, Fillmore County is part of a 14-county emergency management region established by the State of Nebraska for purposes including but not limited to Interoperable Communication Planning and System Implementation, Disaster Planning, the Emergency Management, Homeland Security & Interoperable Communications Grant Programs, and other programs as prescribed by State and Federal authorities, and

WHEREAS, by participating in the 14-county Southeast Nebraska Regional Emergency Management Group, Fillmore County must appoint at minimum one person to serve as a member of and participate in the regional governance board to the full extent as permitted and required by the needs of the program. Authority of said appointee shall not exceed authority granted by State Statue and/or policy and procedures of Fillmore County. Such appointment shall be at the pleasure of the governing authority of said County and be perpetual for the duration of the Southeast Regional Governance Board unless the appointee is removed from the position for just cause. Such appointment shall be reviewed each year at the annual organization meeting of the County Board.

The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors does hereby appoint the Fillmore County Emergency Manager Director to the Southeast Regional Governance Board to fulfill all duties as required by the regional Emergency Management Group. The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors does hereby appoint the Fillmore County Deputy Emergency Manager and Fillmore County Sheriff as alternates to the Southeast Regional Governance Board to fulfill all duties as required by the regional Emergency Management Group.

This appointment is considered to be retroactive to the commencement of the region.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

FINDINGS AND DETERMINATIONS

The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of The County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "County") hereby finds and determines as follows:

- 1. The County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "County"), is a county and political subdivision created and existing under the laws of the State of Nebraska (the "State"), including, without limitation, Section 22-130, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended.
- 2. Pursuant to a resolution duly passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors on June 22, 2010 (the "Election Resolution"), an election was duly called and held on August 10, 2010 (the "Election"), at which time there was submitted to the qualified electors of the County a proposition for (a) the issuance general obligation bonds of the County in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,000,000, for the purpose of paying the costs of acquiring, constructing, equipping and furnishing (1) a replacement hospital (the "Hospital Project") and (2) a medical office building (the "MOB Project") to be owned by the County and operated by a board of trustees pursuant to Sections 23-3501 to 23-3527, inclusive, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended; and (b) the levy of an annual tax levy of taxes against all the taxable property in said County in an amount sufficient in rate and amount to pay the interest and principal of said bonds as the same become due to the extent hospital revenues are insufficient for such purposes.
- **3.** Notice of the Election and the submission of the proposition (the "**Election Notice**") was duly given to the qualified electors of the County more than 20 days prior to the Election by publication in the *Nebraska Signal*, a legal newspaper of general circulation within the County, for four successive weeks (five times) beginning July 7, 2010.
- **4.** The Election was held during the times and at the places designated by the Clerk of Fillmore County, Nebraska and provided for in the Election Notice; and, at the Election, there was submitted to the qualified electors of the County the proposition to issue such bonds and levy such taxes to pay for the same in accordance with the Election Resolution and the Election Notice.
- **5.** At the Election 1,714 ballots were cast by the qualified electors of the County, of which 1,298 ballots were cast in favor of the proposition to issue the bonds and levy the taxes, 416 ballots were cast against the proposition to issue the bonds and levy the taxes and 0 ballots were spoiled and/or rejected.
- **6.** More than 50% of the ballots cast at the Election were in favor of the proposition to issue the bonds and levy the taxes.
- 7. The United States of America, Department of Agriculture Rural Development ("USDA") has agreed to purchase bonds authorized at the Election to pay a portion of the costs of the Hospital Project and the MOB Project (collectively, the "Project") in an aggregate principal amount of \$12,600,000 and UMB Bank, N.A., has agreed to (a) purchase bonds authorized at the Election to pay the remaining portion of the costs of the Project in an aggregate principal amount of \$5,400,000 and (b) purchase general obligation hospital bond anticipation notes to be issued by the County in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$12,600,000 to provide interest financing with respect to the portion of the Project to be finance by the bond purchased by USDA.
 - 8. There has been presented to the Board a Bond Resolution of the County entitled as follows:
 - A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF (A) \$12,600,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION HOSPITAL BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, SERIES 2010, AND (B) \$18,000,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION HOSPITAL BONDS, SERIES 2010, OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA; PRESCRIBING THE FORM AND DETAILS OF THE NOTES AND THE BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION HOSPITAL BONDS TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT AND REDEMPTION OF THE NOTES AT OR PRIOR TO THE MATURITY THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF AN ANNUAL TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE OBLIGATIONS AS THEY BECOME DUE TO THE EXTENT NOT PAID FROM OTHER SOURCES; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN OTHER DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH
- **Section 1.** The Bond Resolution in substantially the form presented to the governing body is hereby approved, adopted, ratified and affirmed, together with such changes or modifications as the Chair, the County Attorney, the Hospital and bond counsel shall approve as being in the best interests of the County.
- **Section 2.** The members of the Board and the officers of the Hospital and the County or any of them, be, and hereby are, authorized and directed to take any and all action, including the execution of all papers, certificates, receipts and documents they or any of them may deem necessary or desirable to issue and deliver the County's (a) General Obligation Hospital Bond Anticipation Notes in one or more series in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$12,600,000 (collectively, the "**Notes**"), and (b) General Obligation Hospital Bonds in one or more series in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,000,000 (collectively, the "**Bonds**").
- **Section 3.** The Chair is hereby authorized and directed to offer and sell the Notes and the Bonds in one or more series at a negotiated sale at one time or from time to time at a price not less than 98.00% of the principal amount thereof, which shall include an underwriting discount of not more than 1.50% of the principal amount thereof and to fix, with respect to each series of Notes and Bonds, (a) the dated date thereof, which shall not be

later than December 31, 2010, except that any Bonds purchased by USDA may be dated later than December 31, 2010, (b) the principal amount of each series of Notes and each series of Bonds including the principal amounts of the respective serial bonds and term bonds of such series of the Bonds and the denominations thereof; provided, however that the aggregate amount of the Notes to be issued pursuant to the Bond Resolution shall not exceed \$12,600,000 and the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be issued pursuant to the Bond Resolution shall not exceed \$18,000,000; (c) the rate or rates of interest to be borne by each maturity of each series of the Notes and the Bonds such that the true interest cost on each series of the Notes and the Bonds (taking into account any interest payment subsidy from the federal government) shall not exceed 5.50% per annum, calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months; (d) the principal amount of each series of the Bonds maturing in each year or the amount of installments of principal and interest due in each year; (e) the mandatory sinking fund redemption dates and the principal amount of each series of Bonds which shall be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption; (f) the dates upon which each series of Bonds will be subject to redemption at the option of the County and the Redemption Price of each series of Bonds, which shall not exceed 104% of the principal amount being redeemed, and the period(s) during which each Redemption Price is applicable; (g) the final maturity date of each series of Bonds, which shall be not later than December 31, 2050, except that Bonds purchased by USDA may have a final maturity later than December 31, 2050; (h) any additional accounts or subaccounts to be established within the funds created by the Bond Resolution, (h) the form, content, terms, and provisions of any closing and other documentation executed and delivered by the Agency in connection with authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of each series of the Notes and the Bonds, and (i) all of the other terms and provisions of each series of the Notes and the Bonds not otherwise specified or fixed by the provisions of the Bond Resolution or this Resolution.

Section 4. All actions heretofore taken for or on behalf of, or in the name of the County, by any of the members, officers or agents thereof or by any officers or agents of the Hospital with respect to the authorization or negotiation of the Notes and the Bonds are hereby validated, ratified and confirmed.

RESPONSIBLE CHARGE PERSON

RESOLUTION 2010-43

WHEREAS: Fillmore County has a full-time public employee on staff, or has obtained the services of a full-time public employee (an interlocal cooperation agreement, if applicable, is attached) who is fully qualified and has the time and interest in serving as a "Responsible Charge" (RC) for this project. The designated RC will be in day-to-day responsible charge of all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, with the express purpose of doing all things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal-aid transportation project funding; and

WHEREAS: the RC will ensure that, at a minimum, (1) the project receives independent and careful development, supervision and inspection, (2) the project is constructed in compliance with the plans and specifications, (3) all aspects of the project, from planning through construction activities, including all environmental commitments, remain eligible for federal funding, and (4) decisions made and actions taken for the project have adequate supporting documentation filed in an organized fashion.

For purposes of this resolution, the following definitions will apply:

Fully qualified means a person who has satisfactorily completed all applicable Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) training courses and who has met the other requirements necessary to be included on the NDOR list of qualified Local Public Agency (LPA) RCs.

Full-time public employee means a public employee who meets all the requirements and is afforded all the benefits of full-time employees as that phrase is applied to other employees of the employing public entity. A person is not a full-time public employee if that person provides outside private consulting services, or is employed by any private entity, unless that person can prove to NDOR in advance, that employee's non-public employment is in a field unrelated to any aspect of the project for which federal aid is sought.

Public employee means a person who is employed solely by a county, a municipality, a political subdivision; a Native American tribe; a school district; another entity that is either designated by statute as public or quasipublic; or an entity included on the list of entities determined by the NDOR, and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as fulfilling public or quasi-public functions.

Responsible charge means the public employee who is fully empowered by the LPA and has actual day-to-day working knowledge and responsibility for all decisions related to all aspects of the federal-aid project from planning through construction project activities, including all environmental commitments. The RC is the day-to-day project manager, and the LPA's point-of-contact for the project. Responsible charge does not mean merely delegating the various tasks; it means active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, making decisions, and actively monitoring project construction. It is understood that the RC may delegate or contract certain technical tasks associated with the project so long as the RC actively manages and represents the owner's interests in the delegated technical tasks.

BE IT RESOLVED: by the <u>Board of Supervisors</u> of <u>Fillmore County</u> that Jerry Lukes, Fillmore County Road Foreman is hereby designated as Responsible Charge (RC) for pre-construction and construction phases, in accordance with the Project Program Agreement previously executed, the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects, and all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines for the following Federal-aid transportation project:

NDOR Project Number <u>BRO-7030(30)</u>, NDOR Control Number <u>42226</u>, <u>Geneva Northwest</u>





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- 1) It has authorized and fully empowered the RC to be in day-to-day responsible charge of the subject federal-aid project; this does not mean merely supervising, overseeing or delegating the various tasks, it means active day-to-day involvement in the project including identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making.
- 2) The RC is a full-time public employee.
- The RC is fully qualified and has successfully completed required training to serve as a RC.
- 4) It will allow the RC to spend all time reasonably necessary to properly discharge all duties associated with the project, including ensuring that all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, remain eligible for federal-aid highway project funding.
- It will not assign other duties to the RC that would affect his or her ability to properly carry out the duties set out in this agreement.
- It will provide necessary office space, materials and administrative support for the RC.
- 7) It will fully cooperate with, support and not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day control of the RC concerning the acts necessary for making the project eligible for federal funding.
- 8) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to comply and assist the RC in complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid transportation projects, including, but not limited to, all applicable requirements of 23 CFR 635.105.
- It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to ensure that the RC's work on the project would be deemed to meet the same standards that the Nebraska Department of Roads must meet under 23 CFR 635.105.
- 10) It will comply with the conflict-of-interest requirements of 23 CFR 1.33.
- 11) It will notify NDOR immediately in the event the designated RC(s) will no longer be assigned to the project. A supplemental agreement designating a replacement RC may be required by NDOR.
- 12) It is ultimately responsible for complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid highway projects. This includes meeting all post-construction environmental commitments. The LPA understands that failure to meet any eligibility requirements for federal funding may result in the loss of all Federal funding for the project. In the event that the acts or omissions of RC, the LPA or its agents or representatives result in a finding that a project is ineligible for Federal funding, the LPA will be required to repay NDOR some or all previously paid Federal funds and any costs or expenses NDOR has incurred for the project, including but not limited to, those costs for the RC.

Fillmore County understands that the following are the duties of the RC:

- a) Serve as the LPA's contact for issues or inquiries for Federal-aid projects assigned by the LPA;
- b) Ensure that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines are followed during the development and construction of the project:
- Know and follow the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects;
- d) Have active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making:
- e) Ensure that the project plans and specifications are sealed, signed and dated by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska, and that estimates have been prepared and the construction has been observed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska or a person under the direct supervision of a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska (reference Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-3445);
- f) Competently manage and coordinate the project day-to-day operations, including all project-related decisions, on behalf of the LPA, which includes the LPA's governing body, staff and any extended staff dedicated to the project such as consulting engineers;
- Ensure that project documents are thoroughly checked, reviewed and have had quality control measures applied, prior to submitting to NDOR and/or FHWA;
- h) Monitor the progress and schedule of the project and be responsible for ensuring that the project is completed on time in accordance with established milestone dates:
- Properly serve as the owner's representative, and to visit the project site during construction on a frequency commensurate with the magnitude and complexity of the project;
- i) Ensure that proper construction management processes have been developed and implemented for the project;
- Serve as a steward of the public funds, i.e. ensure that the public gets what it is paying for;
- I) Attend all required training including the annual workshop; and
- m) Fulfill continuing education requirements as specified in the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects.

RESPONSIBLE CHARGE PERSON

After discussion, Simacek moved and Yates seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2010 – 44

WHEREAS: Fillmore County has a full-time public employee on staff, or has obtained the services of a full-time public employee (an interlocal cooperation agreement, if applicable, is attached) who is fully qualified and has the time and interest in serving as a "Responsible Charge" (RC) for this project. The designated RC will be in day-to-day responsible charge of all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, with the express purpose of doing all things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal-aid transportation project funding; and

WHEREAS: the RC will ensure that, at a minimum, (1) the project receives independent and careful development, supervision and inspection, (2) the project is constructed in compliance with the plans and specifications, (3) all aspects of





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the project, from planning through construction activities, including all environmental commitments, remain eligible for federal funding, and (4) decisions made and actions taken for the project have adequate supporting documentation filed in an organized fashion.

For purposes of this resolution, the following definitions will apply:

Fully qualified means a person who has satisfactorily completed all applicable Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) training courses and who has met the other requirements necessary to be included on the NDOR list of qualified Local Public Agency (LPA) RCs.

Full-time public employee means a public employee who meets all the requirements and is afforded all the benefits of full-time employees as that phrase is applied to other employees of the employing public entity. A person is not a full-time public employee if that person provides outside private consulting services, or is employed by any private entity, unless that person can prove to NDOR in advance, that employee's non-public employment is in a field unrelated to any aspect of the project for which federal aid is sought.

Public employee means a person who is employed solely by a county, a municipality, a political subdivision; a Native American tribe; a school district; another entity that is either designated by statute as public or quasipublic; or an entity included on the list of entities determined by the NDOR, and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as fulfilling public or quasi-public functions.

Responsible charge means the public employee who is fully empowered by the LPA and has actual day-to-day working knowledge and responsibility for all decisions related to all aspects of the federal-aid project from planning through construction project activities, including all environmental commitments. The RC is the day-to-day project manager, and the LPA's point-of-contact for the project. Responsible charge does not mean merely delegating the various tasks; it means active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, making decisions, and actively monitoring project construction. It is understood that the RC may delegate or contract certain technical tasks associated with the project so long as the RC actively manages and represents the owner's interests in the delegated technical tasks.

BE IT RESOLVED: by the <u>Board of Supervisors</u> of <u>Fillmore County</u> that Jerry Lukes, Fillmore County Road Foreman is hereby designated as Responsible Charge (RC) for pre-construction and construction phases, in accordance with the Project Program Agreement previously executed, the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects, and all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines for the following Federal-aid transportation project:

NDOR Project Number <u>BRO-7030(33)</u>, NDOR Control Number <u>42436</u>, Geneva East

Fillmore County assures and agrees that:

- 1) It has authorized and fully empowered the RC to be in day-to-day responsible charge of the subject federal-aid project; this does not mean merely supervising, overseeing or delegating the various tasks, it means active day-to-day involvement in the project including identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making.
- 2) The RC is a full-time public employee.
- 3) The RC is fully qualified and has successfully completed required training to serve as a RC.
- 4) It will allow the RC to spend all time reasonably necessary to properly discharge all duties associated with the project, including ensuring that all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, remain eligible for federal-aid highway project funding.
- 5) It will not assign other duties to the RC that would affect his or her ability to properly carry out the duties set out in this agreement.
- It will provide necessary office space, materials and administrative support for the RC.
- 7) It will fully cooperate with, support and not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day control of the RC concerning the acts necessary for making the project eligible for federal funding.
- 8) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to comply and assist the RC in complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid transportation projects, including, but not limited to, all applicable requirements of 23 CFR 635.105.





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- 9) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to ensure that the RC's work on the project would be deemed to meet the same standards that the Nebraska Department of Roads must meet under 23 CFR 635.105.
- 10) It will comply with the conflict-of-interest requirements of 23 CFR 1.33.
- 11) It will notify NDOR immediately in the event the designated RC(s) will no longer be assigned to the project. A supplemental agreement designating a replacement RC may be required by NDOR.
- 12) It is ultimately responsible for complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid highway projects. This includes meeting all post-construction environmental commitments. The LPA understands that failure to meet any eligibility requirements for federal funding may result in the loss of all Federal funding for the project. In the event that the acts or omissions of RC, the LPA or its agents or representatives result in a finding that a project is ineligible for Federal funding, the LPA will be required to repay NDOR some or all previously paid Federal funds and any costs or expenses NDOR has incurred for the project, including but not limited to, those costs for the RC.

Fillmore County understands that the following are the duties of the RC:

- a) Serve as the LPA's contact for issues or inquiries for Federal-aid projects assigned by the LPA;
- b) Ensure that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines are followed during the development and construction of the project:
- c) Know and follow the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects;
- d) Have active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making;
- e) Ensure that the project plans and specifications are sealed, signed and dated by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska, and that estimates have been prepared and the construction has been observed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska or a person under the direct supervision of a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska (reference Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-3445);
- f) Competently manage and coordinate the project day-to-day operations, including all project-related decisions, on behalf of the LPA, which includes the LPA's governing body, staff and any extended staff dedicated to the project such as consulting engineers;
- g) Ensure that project documents are thoroughly checked, reviewed and have had quality control measures applied, prior to submitting to NDOR and/or FHWA;
- h) Monitor the progress and schedule of the project and be responsible for ensuring that the project is completed on time in accordance with established milestone dates;
- i) Properly serve as the owner's representative, and to visit the project site during construction on a frequency commensurate with the magnitude and complexity of the project;
- i) Ensure that proper construction management processes have been developed and implemented for the project:
- k) Serve as a steward of the public funds, i.e. ensure that the public gets what it is paying for;
- I) Attend all required training including the annual workshop; and
- m) Fulfill continuing education requirements as specified in the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects.
