Reorganization Meeting

The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors convened to reorganize, as required by statute, in open and public session at 9:10 a.m. on January 11, 2011, in the Courthouse Boardroom in Geneva, Nebraska. Members present were Yates, Noel, Simacek, Capek, Mueller, Galusha, and Cerny. The County Clerk was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Notice of the meeting was given by publication. A copy of the publication is on file in the County Clerk's office. All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public. Agenda was approved as presented. The Chairman noted that the public meeting guidelines are posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested. The reorganization meeting adjourned at 9:36 a.m.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The County Clerk, acting as temporary Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m. The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2011. Mueller nominated Capek and Simacek seconded the nomination and requested that nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

The temporary Chairman declared Capek to be the Board Chairman for the year 2011 and Capek assumed the chair.

NAMING OFFICIAL BANK DEPOSITORIES

Yates moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2011-01

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the First National Bank of Exeter, the Geneva State Bank of Geneva, Shickley, Grafton, and Fairmont, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, and the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan, are hereby designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.

RESOLUTION 2011-02

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be authorized to invest the surplus funds of said county in United States Government Bonds, United States Treasury Notes, Bills or Certificates of Indebtedness maturing within two years of the date of purchase; and in Certificates of Deposit, or Money Market Savings Accounts.

Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

Cerny moved and Simacek seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2011-3

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capital stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2011, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$100,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

WHEREAS, Steven Yates is the sole proprietor of a business operated in Geneva, Fillmore County, Nebraska under the name of Geneva Welding and Supply, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the County of Fillmore on a regular basis does business with Geneva Welding and Supply, Inc.;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska does hereby approve the purchase of merchandise and material from Steven Yates doing business as Geneva Welding and Supply, Inc., and the sale by Steven Yates of merchandise and material to the County of Fillmore on a per invoice basis in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00, without the prior approval by virtue of a resolution passed by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska;

RC FOR PROJECT 7030(32)

RESOLUTION 2011 - 24

WHEREAS, <u>Fillmore County</u> has a full-time public employee on staff, or has obtained the services of a full-time public employee (an interlocal cooperation agreement, if applicable, is attached) who is fully qualified and has the time and interest in serving as a "Responsible Charge" (RC) for this project. The designated RC will be in day-to-day responsible charge of all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, with the express purpose of doing all things necessary for the project to remain eligible for federal-aid transportation project funding; and





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WHEREAS, the RC will ensure that, at a minimum, (1) the project receives independent and careful development, supervision and inspection, (2) the project is constructed in compliance with the plans and specifications, (3) all aspects of the project, from planning through construction activities, including all environmental commitments, remain eligible for federal funding, and (4) decisions made and actions taken for the project have adequate supporting documentation filed in an organized fashion.

For purposes of this resolution, the following definitions will apply:

Fully qualified means a person who has satisfactorily completed all applicable Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) training courses and who has met the other requirements necessary to be included on the NDOR list of qualified Local Public Agency (LPA) RCs.

Full-time public employee means a public employee who meets all the requirements and is afforded all the benefits of full-time employees as that phrase is applied to other employees of the employing public entity. A person is not a full-time public employee if that person provides outside private consulting services, or is employed by any private entity, unless that person can prove to NDOR in advance, that employee's non-public employment is in a field unrelated to any aspect of the project for which federal aid is sought.

Public employee means a person who is employed solely by a county, a municipality, a political subdivision; a Native American tribe; a school district; another entity that is either designated by statute as public or quasipublic; or an entity included on the list of entities determined by the NDOR, and approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as fulfilling public or quasi-public functions.

Responsible charge means the public employee who is fully empowered by the LPA and has actual day-to-day working knowledge and responsibility for all decisions related to all aspects of the federal-aid project from planning through construction project activities, including all environmental commitments. The RC is the day-to-day project manager, and the LPA's point-of-contact for the project. Responsible charge does not mean merely delegating the various tasks; it means active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, making decisions, and actively monitoring project construction. It is understood that the RC may delegate or contract certain technical tasks associated with the project so long as the RC actively manages and represents the owner's interests in the delegated technical tasks.

Be It Resolved: by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County that:

Mark Timmerman, Fillmore County Highway Superintendent is hereby designated as Responsible Charge (RC) for preconstruction and construction phases, in accordance with the Project Program Agreement previously executed the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects, and all Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines for the following Federal-aid transportation project:

NDOR Project Number BRO-7030(32),

NDOR Control Number 42435, Geneva West.

Fillmore County assures and agrees that:

- 1) It has authorized and fully empowered the RC to be in day-to-day responsible charge of the subject federal-aid project; this does not mean merely supervising, overseeing or delegating the various tasks, it means active day-to-day involvement in the project including identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making.
- 2) The RC is a full-time public employee.
- 3) The RC is fully qualified and has successfully completed required training to serve as a RC.
- 4) It will allow the RC to spend all time reasonably necessary to properly discharge all duties associated with the project, including ensuring that all aspects of the project, from planning through post-construction activities, remain eligible for federal-aid highway project funding.
- It will not assign other duties to the RC that would affect his or her ability to properly carry out the duties set out in this agreement.
- 6) It will provide necessary office space, materials and administrative support for the RC.
- 7) It will fully cooperate with, support and not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day control of the RC concerning the acts necessary for making the project eligible for federal funding.
- 8) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to comply and assist the RC in complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid transportation projects, including, but not limited to, all applicable requirements of 23 CFR 635.105.





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- 9) It will take all necessary actions and make its best good faith efforts to ensure that the RC's work on the project would be deemed to meet the same standards that the Nebraska Department of Roads must meet under 23 CFR 635.105.
- 10) It will comply with the conflict-of-interest requirements of 23 CFR 1.33.
- 11) It will notify NDOR immediately in the event the designated RC(s) will no longer be assigned to the project. A supplemental agreement designating a replacement RC may be required by NDOR.
- 12) It is ultimately responsible for complying with all federal and state requirements and policies applicable to federal-aid highway projects. This includes meeting all post-construction environmental commitments. The LPA understands that failure to meet any eligibility requirements for federal funding may result in the loss of all Federal funding for the project. In the event that the acts or omissions of RC, the LPA or its agents or representatives result in a finding that a project is ineligible for Federal funding, the LPA will be required to repay NDOR some or all previously paid Federal funds and any costs or expenses NDOR has incurred for the project, including but not limited to, those costs for the RC.

Fillmore County understands that the following are the duties of the RC:

- a) Serve as the LPA's contact for issues or inquiries for Federal-aid projects assigned by the LPA;
- b) Ensure that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, policies and guidelines are followed during the development and construction of the project:
- c) Know and follow the NDOR LPA Guidelines Manual for Federal-aid Projects;
- d) Have active day-to-day involvement in identifying issues, investigating options, working directly with stakeholders, and decision-making;
- e) Ensure that the project plans and specifications are sealed, signed and dated by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska, and that estimates have been prepared and the construction has been observed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska or a person under the direct supervision of a professional engineer licensed in the State of Nebraska (reference Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-3445);
- f) Competently manage and coordinate the project day-to-day operations, including all project-related decisions, on behalf of the LPA, which includes the LPA's governing body, staff and any extended staff dedicated to the project such as consulting engineers;
- g) Ensure that project documents are thoroughly checked, reviewed and have had quality control measures applied, prior to submitting to NDOR and/or FHWA;

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PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION HIGHWAY ALLOCATION FUND PLEDGE BONDS, SERIES 2006.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u> Fillmore County, Nebraska (the "**County**") has previously issued its General Obligation Highway Allocation Fund Pledge Bonds, Series 2006, dated May 23, 2006, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$400,000 (the "**Series 2006 Bonds**"), of which \$220,000 in aggregate principal amount are presently outstanding. The Series 2006 Bonds were authorized by a resolution (the "**Series 2006 Resolution**") duly passed and adopted by the County's Board of Supervisors (the "**Board**") and were issued for the purpose of paying the costs of constructing certain highways and roads and other related improvements within the County.

<u>Section 2</u>. As set forth in the Series 2006 Resolution, the Series 2006 Bonds maturing on or after May 1, 2012 are subject to redemption at any time on or after May 1, 2011, as a whole or in part from time to time at the principal amount thereof, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2006 Bonds called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the date fixed for redemption.

<u>Section 3</u>. The following Series 2006 Bonds are hereby called for redemption and payment on August 2, 2011 (the "Redemption Date"), at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2006 Bonds so called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the Redemption Date, all in accordance with redemption provisions set forth in the Series 2006 Resolution, after which date interest on such bonds shall cease:

<u>Section 5</u>. As soon as practicable, but not later than 35 days prior to the Redemption Date, the County Clerk is hereby directed to file a true copy of this Resolution with the Refunded Bonds Registrar. The Refunded Bonds Registrar is hereby instructed to mail notice to each registered owner of the Refunded Bonds not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption, all in accordance with the Series 2006 Resolution.

RESOLUTION 2011 – 26

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (THE "BOARD") OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA (THE "COUNTY") AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE BY THE COUNTY OF ITS HIGHWAY ALLOCATION FUND PLEDGE BONDS, SERIES 2011, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF





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TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$225,000); PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS; PLEDGING FUNDS TO BE RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY FROM THE STATE OF NEBRASKA HIGHWAY ALLOCATION FUND FOR THE PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES TO PAY THE SAME IF NECESSARY; AUTHORIZING THE DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER THEREOF; DESIGNATING THE BONDS AS QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS AND DOCUMENTS AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Fillmore County, Nebraska (the "County"), hereby find and determine that:

- (a) Pursuant to Section 66-4,101, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "**Act**"), the County may issue its bonds for the purpose of funding the costs of constructing certain highways, roads and other appurtenant related improvements within the County and may pledge to the repayment of such bonds (i) amounts received from the Nebraska Highway Allocation Fund and (ii) its full faith and credit and general taxing power.
- (b) The County has previously issued pursuant to the Act its General Obligation Highway Allocation Fund Pledge Bonds, Series 2006, dated May 23, 2006, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$400,000 (the "Series 2006 Bonds"), of which \$220,000 in aggregate principal amount are presently outstanding. The Series 2006 Bonds were authorized by a resolution (the "Series 2006 Resolution") duly passed and adopted by the Board and were issued for the purpose of paying the costs of constructing certain highways, roads and other appurtenant related improvements within the County.
- (c) Since the issuance of the Series 2006 Bonds, the rates of interest available in the markets have declined such that the County can effect a savings in interest costs by providing for payment in all or part of the Series 2006 Bonds through the issuance of its general obligation refunding bonds pursuant to Section 10-142, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended.
- (d) As set forth in the Series 2006 Resolution, the Series 2006 Bonds maturing on or after May 1, 2012 are subject to redemption at any time on or after May 1, 2011, as a whole or in part from time to time at the principal amount thereof, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2006 Bonds called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the date fixed for redemption.
- (e) By resolution of the Board adopted on June 28, 2011, the County has duly called for redemption the following Series 2006 Bonds, all in accordance with redemption provisions set for in the Series 2006 Resolution, after which date interest on such bonds shall cease:

Said Series 2006 Bonds so called for redemption are hereinafter referred to as the "Refunded Bonds."

- (f) The County has on hand \$1,891.28, which represents funds on deposit with the County to pay for the principal and interest on the Refunded Bonds in addition to the funds which are to be deposited in accordance with Section 8 of this Resolution.
- (g) To provide funds for the redemption of the Refunded Bonds, it is necessary and advisable that the County issue its highway allocation pledge fund bonds which will be payable from (i) amounts received from the Nebraska Highway Allocation Fund and (ii) a tax to be levied against the taxable property of the County.





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(h) All conditions, acts, and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to the issuance of refunding bonds pursuant to Section 10-142, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, do exist and have been done as required by law.

<u>Section 2</u>. (a) There shall be and are hereby ordered issued the negotiable general obligation refunding bonds of the County in the aggregate principal amount of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000), designated as "Highway Allocation Fund Pledge Bonds, Series 2011" (the "Series 2011 Bonds"). The Series 2011 Bonds shall be issued only as fully registered bonds, without coupons, on the books of the Registrar and Paying Agent designated in Section 4 hereof (the "Registrar") in the denomination of \$5,000 or any whole multiple thereof not exceeding the principal amount due on a given date of maturity, and shall be numbered consecutively from one upward in order of issuance. The Date of Original Issue of the Bonds shall be the date of delivery, and the Bonds shall mature and bear interest, calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months, as follows:

- (b) The Series 2011 Bonds shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.
- (c) Interest on the Series 2011 Bonds at the respective rates for each maturity shall be payable semiannually on May 1 and November 1 of each year, beginning November 1, 2011, until maturity or earlier redemption (each of said dates an "Interest Payment Date") from the Date of Original Issue or the most recent Interest Payment Date, whichever is later, by check or draft mailed by the Registrar or its successor on such Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Series 2011 Bond at such registered owner's address as it appears on the Bond Register maintained by the Registrar or its successor as of the fifteenth day (whether or not a business day) of the month immediately preceding such Interest Payment Date (the "Record Date") subject to the provisions of the following paragraph. The principal of the Series 2011 Bonds and the interest due at maturity or upon redemption prior to maturity is payable in lawful money of the United States of America to the registered owners thereof upon presentation and surrender of such Series 2011 Bonds to the Registrar at its principal trust office.

If any payments of interest due on the Series 2011 Bonds on an Interest Payment Date are not timely made, such interest shall cease to be payable to the registered owners as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date and shall be payable to the registered owners of the Series 2011 Bonds as of a special date of record for payment of such defaulted interest as shall be designated by the Registrar whenever monies for the purpose of paying such defaulted interest becomes available.

If the date for payment of the principal of or the interest on the Series 2011 Bonds shall be a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or day on which banking institutions in the city in which the principal corporate trust office of the Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive order to close, the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or day on which such banking institutions are authorized to close, and payment on such day shall have the same force and effect as if made on the nominal payment date.

(d) The Series 2011 Bonds shall be executed on behalf of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson of the Board and the County Clerk or such other persons authorized to sign on their behalf. In case any officer whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature shall appear on the Series 2011 Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of any Series 2011 Bonds, such signature or facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if he had remained in office until delivery. Notwithstanding such execution, no Series 2011 Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or entitled to any security or benefit under this Resolution (the "Resolution") unless and until a certificate of authentication on such Series 2011 Bond has been duly executed by the manual signature of an authorized representative of the Registrar. Certificates of authentication on different Series 2011 Bonds need not be signed by the same





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representative. The executed certificate of authentication on each Series 2011 Bond shall be conclusive evidence that it has been authenticated and delivered under this Resolution.

- (e) If any Series 2011 Bond is mutilated, lost, stolen or destroyed, the County shall execute a new Series 2011 Bond of like date, maturity and denomination to that mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed, provided that, in the case of any mutilated Series 2011 Bond, such mutilated Series 2011 Bond shall first be surrendered to the Registrar and, in the case of any lost, stolen, or destroyed Series 2011 Bonds, there first shall be furnished to the Registrar evidence of such loss, theft, or destruction satisfactory to the Registrar, together with an indemnity satisfactory to it. If such Series 2011 Bond shall have matured, instead of issuing a duplicate Series 2011 Bond, the County may pay the same without surrender thereof upon the performance of such requirements as it deems fit for its protection, including a lost instrument bond. The County and the Registrar may charge the owner of such Series 2011 Bond with their reasonable fees and expenses for such service.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Series 2011 Bonds shall be issued initially as "book-entry-only" bonds under the services of The Depository Trust Company (the "**Depository**"), with one typewritten bond per maturity being issued to the Depository. In such connection the officers of the County are authorized to execute and deliver a Letter of Representations (the "Letter of Representations") in the form required by the Depository, for and on behalf of the County, which shall thereafter govern matters with respect to registration, transfer, payment and redemption of the Series 2011 Bonds. If the Series 2011 Bonds are issued as "book-entry-only" bonds, the following provisions shall apply:
 - (a) The County and the Registrar shall have no responsibility or obligation to any broker-dealer, bank or other financial institution for which the Depository holds Bonds as securities depository (each, a "Bond Participant") or to any person who is an actual purchaser of a Bond from a Bond Participant while the Series 2011 Bonds are in book-entry form (each, a "Beneficial Owner") with respect to the following:
 - (i) the accuracy of the records of the Depository, any nominees of the Depository or any Bond Participant with respect to any ownership interest in the Series 2011 Bonds,
 - (ii) the delivery to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any notice with respect to the Series 2011 Bonds, including any notice of redemption, if any, or
 - (iii) the payment to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any amount with respect to the Series 2011 Bonds. The Registrar shall make payments with respect to the Series 2011 Bonds only to or upon the order of the Depository or its nominee, and all such payments shall be valid and effective fully to satisfy and discharge the obligations with respect to such Series 2011 Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. No person other than the Depository shall receive an authenticated Bond, except as provided in (v) below.
 - (b) Upon receipt by the Registrar of written notice from the Depository to the effect that the Depository is unable or unwilling to discharge its responsibilities, the Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange Bonds requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts. Whenever the Depository requests the Registrar to do so, the Registrar will cooperate with the Depository in taking appropriate action after reasonable notice (A) to arrange, with the prior written consent of the County, for a substitute depository willing and able upon reasonable and customary terms to maintain custody of the Series 2011 Bonds or (B) to make available Bonds registered in whatever name or names as the Beneficial Owners transferring or exchanging such Series 2011 Bonds shall designate.
 - (c) If the County determines that it is desirable that certificates representing the Series 2011 Bonds be delivered to the ultimate beneficial owners of the Series 2011 Bonds and so notifies the Registrar in writing, the Registrar shall so notify the Depository, whereupon the Depository will notify the Bond Participants of the availability through the Depository of bond certificates representing the Series 2011 Bonds. In such event, the Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates representing the Series 2011 Bonds as requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts and in authorized denominations.
 - (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution to the contrary, so long as any Bond is registered in the name of the Depository or any nominee thereof, all payments with respect to such Series 2011





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Bond and all notices with respect to such Series 2011 Bond shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository as provided in the Letter of Representations.

- (e) Registered ownership of the Series 2011 Bonds may be transferred on the books of registration maintained by the Registrar, and the Series 2011 Bonds may be delivered in physical form to the following:
 - (i) any successor securities depository or its nominee;
 - (ii) any person, upon (1) the resignation of the Depository from its functions as depository or (2) termination of the use of the Depository pursuant to this Section and the terms of the Bond Registrar and Paying Agent's Agreement.
- (f) In the event of any partial redemption of a Bond unless and until such partially redeemed Bond has been replaced in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, the books and records of the Registrar shall govern and establish the principal amount of such Series 2011 Bonds as is then outstanding and all of the Series 2011 Bonds issued to the Depository or its nominee shall contain a legend to such effect.

If for any reason the Depository resigns and is not replaced, the County shall immediately provide a supply of printed bond certificates, duly executed by manual or facsimile signatures of the President and Secretary, for issuance upon the transfers from the Depository and subsequent transfers or in the event of partial redemption. If such supply of certificates shall be insufficient to meet the requirements of the Registrar for issuance of replacement certificates upon transfer or partial redemption, the County agrees to order printed an additional supply of such certificates and to direct their execution by manual or facsimile signatures of its then duly qualified and acting President and Secretary.

- <u>Section 4</u>. (a) Cornerstone Bank in York, Nebraska, shall serve as the initial Bond Registrar and Paying Agent (the "Registrar") for the Series 2011 Bonds. The County reserves the right to remove the Registrar upon 30 days' notice and upon the appointment of a successor Registrar, in which event the predecessor Registrar shall deliver all cash and Bonds in its possession to the successor Registrar and shall deliver the bond register to the successor Registrar.
 - The Registrar shall keep and maintain for the County books for the registration and transfer of the Series 2011 Bonds at its office in Kansas City, Missouri. The names and registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the Series 2011 Bonds shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any Series 2011 Bond may be transferred pursuant to its provisions at the office of the Registrar by surrender of such Series 2011 Bond for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to the Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by such owner's duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Registrar on behalf of the County will deliver at such office (or send by registered mail to the transferee owner or owners thereof at such transferee owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of the transferee owner or owners, a new Series 2011 Bond of the same interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity, bearing numbers not contemporaneously then outstanding. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the Series 2011 Bonds by this Resolution, one Series 2011 Bond may be transferred for several such Series 2011 Bonds of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such Series 2011 Bonds may be transferred for one or several such Series 2011 Bonds, respectively, of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a Series 2011 Bond, the surrendered Series 2011 Bond shall be canceled and destroyed. The Registrar may impose a charge sufficient to defray all costs and expenses incident to registrations of transfer and exchanges. In each case the Registrar shall require the payment by the owner requesting exchange or transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer. Series 2011 Bonds issued upon transfer or exchange of Series 2011 Bonds shall be dated as of the date six months preceding the Interest Payment Date next following the date of registration thereof in the office of the Registrar, unless such date of registration shall be an Interest Payment Date, in which case they shall be dated as of such date of registration; provided, however, that if, as shown by the records of the Registrar, interest on the Series 2011 Bonds shall be in default, the Series 2011 Bonds issued in lieu of Series 2011 Bonds surrendered for transfer or exchange may be dated as of the date to which interest has been paid in full on the Series 2011 Bonds surrendered; and provided further, that if the date of registration shall be prior to the first Interest Payment Date, the Series 2011 Bonds shall be dated as of their Date of Original Issue. All Series 2011 Bonds issued upon transfer of the Series 2011 Bonds so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the County evidencing the same obligations as the Series 2011 Bonds surrendered and shall be entitled to all the benefits and protection of this Resolution to the same extent as the Series 2011 Bonds upon transfer of which they were delivered. The County and the Registrar shall not be





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required to transfer any Bond during any period from any Record Date until its immediately following Interest Payment Date or to transfer any Series 2011 Bond called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.

(c) The Registrar shall also be responsible for making the payments of principal and interest as the same fall due upon the Series 2011 Bonds from funds provided by the County for such purposes. Payments of interest due upon the Series 2011 Bonds prior to maturity or redemption shall be made by the Registrar by mailing a check in the amount due for such interest on each Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Series 2011 Bond to such owner's registered address as shown on the books of registration as required to be maintained under this Section 4. On or before each principal or interest due date, without further order of the Board, the Treasurer shall transmit or cause to be transmitted money sufficient for payment of all principal and interest then due. Payments of principal due at maturity or at any date fixed for redemption prior to maturity, together with any accrued interest then due, shall be made by the Registrar upon presentation and surrender of such Series 2011 Bond. The County and the Registrar may treat the registered owner of any Series 2011 Bonds as the absolute owner of such Series 2011 Bond for purposes of making payments thereon and for all other purposes. All payments on account of interest or principal made to the registered owner of any Series 2011 Bond shall be valid and effectual and shall be a discharge of the County and the Registrar in respect of the liability upon the Series 2011 Bonds or claims for interest to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

WHEREAS, more than three years will have elapsed since the issuance of such respective certificates of tax sale and by reason thereof the right of redemption of the owners or claimants of such respective tract has expired;

BE IT NOW RESOLVED that the County Board shall direct the County Attorney to commence foreclosure on such liens or certificates on all real estate which has heretofore been advertised and offered for sale and remains unsold for want of bidders and certificates of tax sale issued thereupon.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA CALLING FOR THE EARLY REDEMPTION OF FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$525,000) IN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2008.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Fillmore County, Nebraska (the "County") has previously issued its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2008, dated April 25, 2008, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$1,455,000 (the "Series 2008 Bonds"), of which \$1,000,000 in aggregate principal amount are presently outstanding. The Series 2008 Bonds were authorized by a resolution (the "Series 2008 Resolution") duly passed and adopted by the County's Board of Supervisors (the "Board").

Section 2. As set forth in the Series 2008 Resolution, the Series 2008 Bonds maturing on or after November 15, 2013 are subject to redemption at any time on or after April 25, 2013, as a whole or in part from time to time at the principal amount thereof, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2008 Bonds called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the date fixed for redemption.

<u>Section 3</u>. The following Series 2008 Bonds are hereby called for redemption and payment on the date to be determined pursuant to Section 5 of this resolution (as described herein, the "**Redemption Date**"), all in accordance with redemption provisions set forth in the Series 2008 Resolution, after which date interest on such bonds shall cease:

<u>Section 4</u>. The principal of and the interest on the Refunded Bonds shall be paid upon presentation and surrender thereof at the office of UMB Bank, N.A. in Kansas City, Missouri, as paying agent and registrar for the Refunded Bonds (the "Refunded Bonds Registrar").

<u>Section 5</u>. The Chairman or the Vice Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk or any officer of the Board or the County is hereby authorized and directed to determine the Redemption Date, on which date the Refunded Bonds shall be redeemed at the redemption price set forth in <u>Section 2</u> hereof.





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<u>Section 6</u>. As soon as practicable, but not later than 35 days prior to the Redemption Date, the County Clerk is hereby directed to file a true copy of this Resolution with the Refunded Bonds Registrar. The Refunded Bonds Registrar is hereby instructed to mail notice to each registered owner of the Refunded Bonds not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption, all in accordance with the Series 2008 Resolution.

AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS SERIES 2011

After discussion, Simacek moved and Noel seconded the introduction of the following resolution with a minimum savings requirement of \$18,000.00 or more based on the amount of debt outstanding and the repayment period:

RESOLUTION 2011 – 40

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (THE "BOARD") OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA (THE "COUNTY") AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE BY THE COUNTY OF ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2011, IN ONE OR MORE SERIES AND IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$565,000); PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS; AUTHORIZING CERTAIN OFFICIALS TO DETERMINE THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS OF THE BONDS, TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FOR THE SALE OF THE BONDS AND TO DESIGNATE A REGISTRAR AND PAYING AGENT WITH RESPECT TO THE BONDS, ALL AS PROVIDED AND SUBJECT TO THE PARAMETERS SET FORTH HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES TO PAY THE BONDS; PLEDGING FUNDS TO BE RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY FROM THE STATE OF NEBRASKA HIGHWAY ALLOCATION FUND FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER THEREOF; DESIGNATING THE BONDS AS QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS AND DOCUMENTS AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Fillmore County, Nebraska (the "County"), hereby find and determine that:

- (a) The County has previously issued its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2008, dated April 25, 2008, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$1,455,000 (the "Series 2008 Bonds"), of which \$1,000,000 in aggregate principal amount is presently outstanding. The Series 2008 Bonds were authorized by a resolution (the "Series 2008 Resolution") duly passed and adopted by the County's Board of Supervisors (the "Board").
- (b) The Series 2008 Bonds were issued for the purposes of refunding (i) all of the outstanding principal amount (\$790,000) of the County's General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2001, dated July 15, 2001 (the "**Series 2001 Bonds**") and (ii) all of the outstanding principal amount (\$605,000) of the County's Highway Allocation Fund Pledge Bonds, Series 2002, dated May 15, 2002 (the "**Series 2002 Bonds**").
- (c) The Series 2001 Bonds were issued for the purpose of refunding all of the outstanding principal amount (\$1,125,000) of the County's General Obligation Bonds, Series 1997, dated May 15, 1997 (the "Series 1997 Bonds"). The Series 1997 Bonds were issued pursuant to Section 23-120, Reissued Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, and were authorized by the required majority of the qualified voters of the County at a special election held on April 8, 1997 for the purpose of paying the costs of renovating and improving the County's existing courthouse and providing equipment and furnishings for such courthouse.
- (d) The Series 2002 Bonds were issued pursuant to Section 66-4,101, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, for the purpose of funding the costs of improving certain roads and other appurtenant related improvements within the County.
- (e) The principal of and the interest on the Series 2008 Bonds allocable and apportioned to refunding the Series 2001 Bonds is payable from a levy of taxes on all of the taxable property in the County unlimited as to rate or





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amount and not subject to any statutory or constitutional limitations. The principal of and the interest on the Series 2008 Bonds allocable and apportioned to refunding the Series 2002 Bonds is payable from (i) a pledge of amounts received by the County from the Highway Allocation Fund of the State of Nebraska and (ii) levy of taxes on all of the taxable property in the County, subject to statutory and constitutional limitations.

- (f) Since the issuance of the Series 2008 Bonds, the rates of interest available in the markets have declined such that the County can effect a savings in interest costs by providing for payment in all or part of the Series 2008 Bonds through the issuance of its general obligation refunding bonds pursuant to Section 10-142, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended.
- (g) As set forth in the Series 2008 Resolution, the Series 2008 Bonds maturing on or after November 15, 2013 are subject to redemption at any time on or after April 25, 2013, as a whole or in part from time to time at the principal amount thereof, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount of the Series 2008 Bonds called for redemption, plus accrued interest on such principal amount being redeemed to the date fixed for redemption.
- (h) By resolution of the Board adopted on October 11, 2011, the County has duly called for redemption the following Series 2008 Bonds, all in accordance with redemption provisions set for in the Series 2008 Resolution, after which date interest on such bonds shall cease:

Said Series 2008 Bonds so called for redemption are hereinafter referred to as the "**Refunded Bonds**." The Series 2008 Bonds maturing on November 15 in the years 2011, 2012 and 2013 shall be paid at the respective maturities thereof.

- (i) The County has on hand no debt service or other sinking fund monies for the payment of principal and interest on the Refunded Bonds other than monies, if any, which are to be deposited in accordance with <u>Section 8</u> of this Resolution.
- (j) To provide funds for the redemption of the Refunded Bonds, it is necessary and advisable that the County issue its general obligation refunding, of which approximately \$322,050 in aggregate principal amount (the "Courthouse Bonds") will be payable from a levy of taxes on all of the taxable property in the County unlimited as to rate or amount and not subject to any statutory or constitutional limitations and \$242,950 in aggregate principal amount (the "Highway Bonds") will be payable from (i) a pledge of amounts received by the County from the Highway Allocation Fund of the State of Nebraska and (ii) levy of taxes on all of the taxable property in the County, subject to statutory and constitutional limitations.
- (k) All conditions, acts, and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to the issuance of refunding bonds pursuant to Section 10-142, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, do exist and have been done as required by law.

<u>Section 2</u>. (a) To provide funds for the redemption and prepayment of the Refunded Bonds, there shall be and there is hereby authorized to be issued interest bearing general obligation bonds of the County to be known as "General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2011" (the "Series 2011 Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed Five Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$565,000). The Series 2011 Bonds shall be issued only as fully registered bonds, without coupons, on the books of the Registrar and Paying Agent designated in <u>Section 4</u> hereof (the "Registrar") in the denomination of \$5,000 or any whole multiple thereof not exceeding the principal amount due on a given date of maturity, and shall be numbered consecutively from one upward in order of issuance. Unless otherwise determined by the Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk (or anyone authorized to act on their behalf), the Series 2011 Bonds shall mature and bear interest calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months.

The Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk (or anyone authorized to act on their behalf) is each individually authorized and directed, in the exercise of his or her independent judgment and absolute discretion, to hereafter, from time to time, specify, set, designate, determine, establish and appoint, as the case may be, and in each case in accordance with and subject to the provisions of this Resolution, (a) the Date of Original Issue, (b) the number of series to be issued, (c) the aggregate principal amount of Series 2011 Bonds to be issued, not exceeding aggregate principal amount set forth in this Section 2, (d) the dates on which a principal maturity of the Series 2011 Bonds shall occur and the

principal amount of the Series 2011 Bonds to mature on such dates, (e) the date of final maturity of the Series 2011 Bonds, which shall in no event be later than November 15, 2017, (f) the date or dates upon which the Series 2011 Bonds shall be sold, (g) the rate or rates of interest to be carried by each maturity of the Series 2011 Bonds, such that the average coupon rate of the Series 2011 Bonds shall not exceed 3.50%, (h) the method by which such rate or rates of interest shall be calculated and the Interest Payment Dates for the Series 2011 Bonds, (i) the redemption dates and prices and all terms relating thereto, if any, (j) all of the other terms of the Series 2011 Bonds not otherwise determined or fixed by the provisions of this Resolution, (k) the form, content, terms and provisions of any bond purchase agreement entered into by the County with the Purchaser set forth in Section 7 hereof, in connection with the sale of the Series 2011 Bonds, (l) the purchase price for the Series 2011 Bonds, which shall not be less than 98.5% of the aggregate principal amount thereof, (m) the form and contents of any preliminary and final official statement or other offering materials of the County utilized in connection with any offering or sale of the Series 2011 Bonds to the public, and (n) the form, content, terms, and provisions of any closing and other documentation executed and delivered by the County in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Series 2011 Bonds.

(b) Redemption Provisions.

- (i) Unless otherwise determined by the Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk (or anyone authorized to act on their behalf), the Series 2011 Bonds maturing on or after on the date five years from their Date of Original Issue shall be subject to redemption at the option of the County on the date five years from their Date of Original Issue and any date thereafter, as a whole or in part, from time to time in such principal amounts and from such maturity or maturities as the County, in its sole and absolute discretion, shall determine, at a redemption price equal to the principal amount thereof, together with the interest accrued thereon to the date fixed for redemption, with no premium.
- The Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk (or anyone authorized to act on their behalf) may designate in a certificate certain Series 2011 Bonds as "Term Bonds", portions of which are to be redeemed on the dates (each such date being herein referred to as a "Sinking Fund Payment Date") and in the amounts (hereinafter referred to as a "Mandatory Sinking Fund Payment") set forth in such certificate. The Registrar shall select and call for redemption, in accordance with this subsection (b), from the Term Bonds the amounts specified by the Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk in the certificate, and the Term Bonds selected by the Registrar shall become due and payable on such date. If Term Bonds are redeemed at the option of the County pursuant to Section 2(b)(i), the Term Bonds so optionally redeemed may, at the option of the County, be applied as a credit against any subsequent Mandatory Sinking Fund Payment with respect to Term Bonds otherwise to be redeemed thereby, such credit to be equal to the principal amount of such Term Bonds redeemed pursuant to Section 2(b)(i), provided that the County shall have delivered to the Registrar not less than 45 days prior to such Sinking Fund Payment Date a certificate stating its election to apply such Term Bonds as such a credit. In such case, the Registrar shall reduce the amount of Term Bonds to be redeemed on the Sinking Fund Payment Date specified in such certificate by the principal amount of Term Bonds so redeemed pursuant to Section 2(b)(i). Any credit given to Mandatory Sinking Fund Payments pursuant to Section 2(b)(i) shall not affect any subsequent Mandatory Sinking Fund Payments, which shall remain payable as otherwise provided in this subsection, unless and until another credit is given in accordance with the provisions hereof.
- (iii) Series 2011 Bonds subject to redemption shall be redeemed in denominations of \$5,000. If any Bond is in a denomination in excess of \$5,000, portions of the principal amount thereof in installments of \$5,000 or any whole multiple thereof may be redeemed, and if less than all of the principal amount thereof is to be redeemed, in such case upon the surrender of such Series 2011 Bonds there shall be issued to the registered owner thereof without charge therefor, for the then unredeemed balance of the principal amount thereof, Series 2011 Bonds of like series, maturity and interest rates in any of the authorized denominations provided by this Resolution. If less than all of the Series 2011 Bonds of any maturity are to be called for redemption, the particular Bonds of such maturity to be redeemed shall be selected by lot.
- (iv) Notice of redemption of Series 2011 Bonds stating their designation, date, maturity, principal amounts and the redemption date shall be given by the Registrar by mailing such notice by first-class mail, postage prepaid, not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption (or such shorter period as may be acceptable to the then registered owner of the Series 2011 Bonds) to the registered owners at their most recent addresses appearing upon the books of the Registrar. Failure to give notice to any particular registered owner or any defect in the notice given to such owner shall not affect the validity of the proceedings calling the Series 2011 Bonds or the redemption of any Series 2011 Bonds for which proper notice has been given. Notice of redemption





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need not be given to the holder of any Series 2011 Bonds, whether registered or not, who has waived notice of redemption. Notice of redemption having been given as provided above or notice of redemption having been waived by the owners of Bonds called for redemption who have not been given such notice as provided above, the Series 2011 Bonds so called for redemption shall become due and payable on the designated redemption date. The County shall give written notice to the Registrar of its election to redeem Bonds at least 45 days prior to the said redemption date, or such shorter period as shall be acceptable to the Registrar. If on or before the said redemption date funds sufficient to pay the Series 2011 Bonds so called for redemption at the applicable redemption price and accrued interest to said date have been deposited or caused to have been deposited by the County with the Registrar for the purposes of such payment and notice of redemption thereof has been given or waived as hereinbefore provided, then from and after the date fixed for redemption interest on such Series 2011 Bonds so called shall cease to accrue and become payable. If such funds shall not have been so deposited with the Registrar as aforesaid no later than the date fixed for redemption, such call for redemption shall be revoked and the Series 2011 Bonds so called for redemption shall continue to be outstanding the same as though they had not been so called; such Series 2011 Bonds shall continue to bear interest until paid at such rate as they would have borne had they not been called for redemption and shall continue to be protected by this resolution and entitled to the benefits and security hereof.

Interest on the Series 2011 Bonds at the respective rates per annum for each maturity is payable semiannually on the dates (each of said dates an "Interest Payment Date") determined by the Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk (or anyone authorized to act on their behalf), from the Date of Original Issue or the most recent Interest Payment Date, whichever is later, until maturity or earlier redemption by check or draft mailed by the Registrar or its successor on such Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Series 2011 Bond at such registered owner's address as it appears on the Bond Register maintained by the Registrar or its successor at the close of business on the last business day of the month preceding any month in which an Interest Payment Date occurs (the "Record Date") subject to the provisions of the following paragraph. The principal of the Series 2011 Bonds and the interest due at maturity or upon redemption prior to maturity is payable in lawful money of the United States of America to the registered owners thereof upon presentation and surrender of such Series 2011 Bonds to the Registrar at its principal trust office.

If any payments of interest due on the Series 2011 Bonds on an Interest Payment Date are not timely made, such interest shall cease to be payable to the registered owners as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date and shall be payable to the registered owners of the Series 2011 Bonds as of a special date of record for payment of such defaulted interest as shall be designated by the Registrar whenever monies for the purpose of paying such defaulted interest becomes available.

If the date for payment of the principal of or the interest on the Series 2011 Bonds shall be a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or day on which banking institutions in the city in which the principal corporate trust office of the Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive order to close, the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or day on which such banking institutions are authorized to close, and payment on such day shall have the same force and effect as if made on the nominal payment date.

- (d) The Series 2011 Bonds shall be executed on behalf of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairman of the Board and the County Clerk or such other persons authorized to sign on their behalf. In case any officer whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature shall appear on the Series 2011 Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of any Series 2011 Bonds, such signature or facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if he had remained in office until delivery. Notwithstanding such execution, no Series 2011 Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or entitled to any security or benefit under this Resolution unless and until a certificate of authentication on such Series 2011 Bond has been duly executed by the manual signature of an authorized representative of the Registrar. Certificates of authentication on different Series 2011 Bonds need not be signed by the same representative. The executed certificate of authentication on each Series 2011 Bond shall be conclusive evidence that it has been authenticated and delivered under this Resolution.
- (e) If any Series 2011 Bond is mutilated, lost, stolen or destroyed, the County shall execute a new Series 2011 Bond of like date, maturity and denomination to that mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed, provided that, in the case of any mutilated Series 2011 Bond, such mutilated Series 2011 Bond shall first be surrendered to the Registrar and, in the case of any lost, stolen, or destroyed Series 2011 Bonds, there first shall be furnished to the Registrar evidence of such loss, theft, or destruction satisfactory to the Registrar, together with an indemnity satisfactory to it. If such Series 2011 Bond shall have matured, instead of issuing a duplicate Series 2011 Bond, the County may pay the same without surrender thereof upon the performance of such requirements as it deems fit for its protection, including a lost instrument bond. The County and the Registrar may charge the owner of such Series 2011 Bond with their reasonable fees and expenses for such service.





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<u>Section 3</u>. The Series 2011 Bonds shall be issued initially as "book-entry-only" bonds under the services of The Depository Trust Company (the "**Depository**"), with one typewritten bond per maturity being issued to the Depository. In such connection the officers of the County are authorized to execute and deliver a Letter of Representations (the "Letter of Representations") in the form required by the Depository, for and on behalf of the County, which shall thereafter govern matters with respect to registration, transfer, payment and redemption of the Series 2011 Bonds. If the Series 2011 Bonds are issued as "book-entry-only" bonds, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) The County and the Registrar shall have no responsibility or obligation to any broker-dealer, bank or other financial institution for which the Depository holds Bonds as securities depository (each, a "Bond Participant") or to any person who is an actual purchaser of a Bond from a Bond Participant while the Series 2011 Bonds are in book-entry form (each, a "Beneficial Owner") with respect to the following:
 - (i) the accuracy of the records of the Depository, any nominees of the Depository or any Bond Participant with respect to any ownership interest in the Series 2011 Bonds,
 - (ii) the delivery to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any notice with respect to the Series 2011 Bonds, including any notice of redemption, if any, or
 - (iii) the payment to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any amount with respect to the Series 2011 Bonds. The Registrar shall make payments with respect to the Series 2011 Bonds only to or upon the order of the Depository or its nominee, and all such payments shall be valid and effective fully to satisfy and discharge the obligations with respect to such Series 2011 Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. No person other than the Depository shall receive an authenticated Bond, except as provided in (v) below.
- (b) Upon receipt by the Registrar of written notice from the Depository to the effect that the Depository is unable or unwilling to discharge its responsibilities, the Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange Bonds requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts. Whenever the Depository requests the Registrar to do so, the Registrar will cooperate with the Depository in taking appropriate action after reasonable notice (A) to arrange, with the prior written consent of the County, for a substitute depository willing and able upon reasonable and customary terms to maintain custody of the Series 2011 Bonds or (B) to make available Bonds registered in whatever name or names as the Beneficial Owners transferring or exchanging such Series 2011 Bonds shall designate.
- (c) If the County determines that it is desirable that certificates representing the Series 2011 Bonds be delivered to the ultimate beneficial owners of the Series 2011 Bonds and so notifies the Registrar in writing, the Registrar shall so notify the Depository, whereupon the Depository will notify the Bond Participants of the availability through the Depository of bond certificates representing the Series 2011 Bonds. In such event, the Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates representing the Series 2011 Bonds as requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts and in authorized denominations.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution to the contrary, so long as any Bond is registered in the name of the Depository or any nominee thereof, all payments with respect to such Series 2011 Bond and all notices with respect to such Series 2011 Bond shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository as provided in the Letter of Representations.
- (e) Registered ownership of the Series 2011 Bonds may be transferred on the books of registration maintained by the Registrar, and the Series 2011 Bonds may be delivered in physical form to the following:
 - (i) any successor securities depository or its nominee;
 - (ii) any person, upon (1) the resignation of the Depository from its functions as depository or (2) termination of the use of the Depository pursuant to this Section and the terms of the Bond Registrar and Paying Agent's Agreement.
- (f) In the event of any partial redemption of a Bond unless and until such partially redeemed Bond has been replaced in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, the books and records of the Registrar





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shall govern and establish the principal amount of such Series 2011 Bonds as is then outstanding and all of the Series 2011 Bonds issued to the Depository or its nominee shall contain a legend to such effect.

If for any reason the Depository resigns and is not replaced, the County shall immediately provide a supply of printed bond certificates, duly executed by manual or facsimile signatures of the President and Secretary, for issuance upon the transfers from the Depository and subsequent transfers or in the event of partial redemption. If such supply of certificates shall be insufficient to meet the requirements of the Registrar for issuance of replacement certificates upon transfer or partial redemption, the County agrees to order printed an additional supply of such certificates and to direct their execution by manual or facsimile signatures of its then duly qualified and acting President and Secretary.

Section 4. (a) Unless otherwise determined by the Chairman of the Board or the County Clerk (or such others authorized to act on their behalf), UMB Bank, N.A. in Kansas City, Missouri, shall serve as the initial Bond Registrar and Paying Agent (the "Registrar") for the Series 2011 Bonds. The Registrar shall serve in such capacities hereunder and under the terms of an agreement entitled "Registrar and Paying Agent Agreement" between the County and the Registrar, the form of which is hereby approved. The Chairman, the Vice Chair, the County Clerk, the County Treasurer or any other officer of the Board or the County is hereby authorized to execute said agreement in substantially the form presented but with such changes as he or she shall deem appropriate or necessary. The County reserves the right to remove the Registrar upon 30 days' notice and upon the appointment of a successor Registrar, in which event the predecessor Registrar shall deliver all cash and Bonds in its possession to the successor Registrar and shall deliver the bond register to the successor Registrar.

- (b) The Registrar shall keep and maintain for the County books for the registration and transfer of the Series 2011 Bonds at its corporate trust office, the location of which having been disclosed to the County from time to time. The names and registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the Series 2011 Bonds shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any Series 2011 Bond may be transferred pursuant to its provisions at the office of the Registrar by surrender of such Series 2011 Bond for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to the Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by such owner's duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Registrar on behalf of the County will deliver at such office (or send by registered mail to the transferee owner or owners thereof at such transferee owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of the transferee owner or owners, a new Series 2011 Bond of the same interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity, bearing numbers not contemporaneously then outstanding. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the Series 2011 Bonds by this Resolution, one Series 2011 Bond may be transferred for several such Series 2011 Bonds of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such Series 2011 Bonds may be transferred for one or several such Series 2011 Bonds, respectively, of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a Series 2011 Bond, the surrendered Series 2011 Bond shall be canceled and destroyed. The Registrar may impose a charge sufficient to defray all costs and expenses incident to registrations of transfer and exchanges. In each case the Registrar shall require the payment by the owner requesting exchange or transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer. Series 2011 Bonds issued upon transfer or exchange of Series 2011 Bonds shall be dated as of the date six months preceding the Interest Payment Date next following the date of registration thereof in the office of the Registrar, unless such date of registration shall be an Interest Payment Date, in which case they shall be dated as of such date of registration; provided, however, that if, as shown by the records of the Registrar, interest on the Series 2011 Bonds shall be in default, the Series 2011 Bonds issued in lieu of Series 2011 Bonds surrendered for transfer or exchange may be dated as of the date to which interest has been paid in full on the Series 2011 Bonds surrendered; and provided further, that if the date of registration shall be prior to the first Interest Payment Date, the Series 2011 Bonds shall be dated as of their Date of Original Issue. All Series 2011 Bonds issued upon transfer of the Series 2011 Bonds so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the County evidencing the same obligations as the Series 2011 Bonds surrendered and shall be entitled to all the benefits and protection of this Resolution to the same extent as the Series 2011 Bonds upon transfer of which they were delivered. The County and the Registrar shall not be required to transfer any Bond during any period from any Record Date until its immediately following Interest Payment Date or to transfer any Series 2011 Bond called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.
- (c) The Registrar shall also be responsible for making the payments of principal and interest as the same fall due upon the Series 2011 Bonds from funds provided by the County for such purposes. Payments of interest due upon the Series 2011 Bonds prior to maturity or redemption shall be made by the Registrar by mailing a check in the amount due for such interest on each Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Series 2011 Bond to such owner's registered address as shown on the books of registration as required to be maintained under this Section 4. On or before each principal or interest due date, without further order of the Board, the Treasurer shall transmit or cause to be transmitted money sufficient for payment of all principal and interest then due. Payments of principal due at maturity or at any date





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fixed for redemption prior to maturity, together with any accrued interest then due, shall be made by the Registrar upon presentation and surrender of such Series 2011 Bond. The County and the Registrar may treat the registered owner of any Series 2011 Bonds as the absolute owner of such Series 2011 Bond for purposes of making payments thereon and for all other purposes. All payments on account of interest or principal made to the registered owner of any Series 2011 Bond shall be valid and effectual and shall be a discharge of the County and the Registrar in respect of the liability upon the Series 2011 Bonds or claims for interest to the extent of the amount or amounts so paid.

Section 5. The Series 2011 Bonds shall be in substantially the following form:

WHEREAS, an interlocal agreement, consistent with Nebraska Revised Statutes13-801 et.seq, would be in the best interest of all participating agencies; and

WHEREAS, the agencies desire to enter into a written interlocal agreement for the purposes of carrying out the RAP objectives and grant requirements of the Nebraska Crime Commission.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The County of Fillmore authorizes William L. Burgess to enter the County of Fillmore into an interlocal agreement for joint and cooperative action pursuant to the provisions of Section 13-801 through 13-807 of Nebraska Revised Statutes. The interlocal agreement shall be for the strict administration of the RAP project and all funds allocated by the Nebraska Crime Commission, and Match dollars allocated by the RAP members. 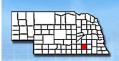

After discussion, Noel moved and Yates seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2011 - 43

Snow Removal Program and Policy

SECTION 1, INTRODUCTION:

The Roads Department of Fillmore County is responsible for providing snow removal for 834 miles of county roads. The Roads Department does not guarantee that county roads will be free of snow and ice after plowing. Bare, dry roads should not be expected and will not be provided. The Roads Department attempts to maintain adequate traction for vehicles properly equipped for winter driving conditions.

Planning for a winter storm is difficult. The differences in rate of snowfall, moisture, content, temperature, time of day and wind velocity make each storm unique.

However, it is the intent of this program to establish general policies and procedures to make travel within the County as safe as possible. Safety is the primary concern and all persons involved with this plan shall consider Safety first in their operating procedures.

The Fillmore County Highway Superintendent is responsible to format and implement this Snow Removal Program and Policy with the input and approval of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors.

SECTION 2, PREPARATION:

- 2.1 The Fillmore County Highway Superintendent will evaluate the Roads Department's efforts from the previous winter. Any adjustments necessary to improve the overall Snow Removal Program and Policy will be made.
- 2.2 Fall preparation shall include review of the equipment required to perform snow removal operations. This equipment shall be maintained in top operating condition while it is being used in other operations during the Spring, Summer and Fall months.
- 2.3 Fall preparation shall also include a meeting of all Fillmore County Roads Department Employees. This meeting shall be used to review equipment operations, safety issues, equipment maintenance, review the efforts from the previous winter and to review all Priority Snow Routes.

SECTION 3, CLASSIFICATION OF COUNTY ROADS:

3.1 - PRIORITY ONE.

The County Roads designated PRIORITY ONE includes all SCHOOL BUS ROUTES within the County as established by the School Districts and with the input of the County Board of Supervisors.

3.2 - PRIORITY TWO.

The County Roads designated as PRIORITY TWO includes all MAIL ROUTES within the County as established by the area Postmasters and with the input of the County Board of Supervisors.

3.3 - PRIORITY THREE.

The County Roads designated as PRIORITY THREE includes OTHER ROADS that have an occupied residence within the mile or a portion of a mile without School Bus Service and Mail Delivery Service. These miles are established by the County Highway Superintendent and with the input of the County Board of Supervisors.

3.4 - PRIORITY FOUR.

The County Roads designated as PRIORITY FOUR includes all OTHER ROADS that have no occupied residence within the mile. These miles are established by the County Highway Superintendent and with the input of the County Board of Supervisors.

SECTION 4. LEVEL OF SERVICE:

4.1 - PRIORITY ONE COUNTY ROADS.

Plowing should begin on PRIORITY ONE County Roads when the accumulation of snow on the roadway exceeds two (2) inches. The roadway accumulation is generally independent of the total accumulation of snow in the area. PRIORITY ONE County Roads should be plowed road edge to road edge before plowing proceeds to any other areas.

4.2 - PRIORITY TWO COUNTY ROADS.

Plowing of PRIORITY TWO County Roads should begin immediately after the completion of PRIORITY ONE County Roads. In some cases, PRIORITY TWO County Roads are also PRIORITY ONE County Roads and they will have already been plowed.

4.3 - PRIORITY THREE COUNTY ROADS.

Plowing operations should begin on these County Roads after the completion of plowing operations on all PRIORITY ONE and PRIORITY TWO County Roads. If snow continues, plowing operations may have to be redirected to PRIORITY ONE and PRIORITY TWO County Roads before the completion of plowing operations on PRIORITY THREE County Roads.

4.4 - PRIORITY FOUR COUNTY ROADS.

The County Roads Department will generally not plow these County Roads unless there is an emergency declared by an adjacent landowner. The Highway Superintendent will determine if the emergency warrants plowing the requested County Road.

SECTION 5. SNOW REMOVAL PERSONNEL:

- 5.1 Snow removal operations will be conducted on a 24-hour basis, seven days a week as needed. Equipment operators and supervisors should also be ready to commence snow removal operations at any time it is determined that operations must begin. The Fillmore County Highway Superintendent shall decide when to call snow removal personnel to work and how long they shall work.
- 5.2 Primary responsibility for snow removal planning, operation direction and snow fighting decision-making will be that of the Fillmore County Highway Superintendent with the assistance of the Fillmore County Roads Foreman. There will always be one (1) person at a time in charge of operations and that person will have all authority and responsibility to conduct snow-plowing operations as outlined in this policy.
- 5.3 If the decision to commence snow removal operations is made during the normal work day, operators and supervisors shall be prepared to cease the activities they are engaged in and begin snow removal preparations and operations.
- 5.4 If the conditions become such that snow removal must begin after normal working hours, the Sheriffs Department will notify the Highway Superintendent or the Roads Foreman who will then notify the necessary number of operators to man the operation.
- 5.5 Rest periods and/or meal breaks shall be coordinated by the supervisor until all PRIORITY ONE County Roads have been plowed. Employees will normally be limited to a maximum of 12 hours of continuous snow plowing. This is in consideration of the safety of the operator, the public and liability exposure to the County. Employees may be requested to work longer than 12 hours during a SNOW EMERGENCY.
- 5.6 Cooperation and communication between the Sheriff's Department and the Fillmore County Roads Department is critical during a winter storm. There will be close contact between the two departments during plowing operations. The Sheriff's Department shall keep the Roads Department informed as to county road conditions and be on the alert for trouble spots including icy roads and bridges and reduced visibility at intersections.

SECTION 6. SNOW PLOWING OPERATIONS:

- 6.1 There are several factors to consider when deciding whether snow-plowing operations should commence. The general rule to be used however, is when accumulations have reached two (2) inches on the road surface itself and snow is falling or forecast predict additional snowfall, operations should commence.
- 6.2 Every County Road in the County will be assigned a plowing priority classification. In any given area, PRIORITY ONE County Roads will be plowed before PRIORITY TWO or THREE County Roads are started. If operations have begun on PRIORITY TWO or THREE County Roads and it continues to snow with sufficient additional accumulation to

require re-plowing, then PRIORITY ONE County Roads will be re-plowed before resuming plowing operations on PRIORITY TWO or THREE County. An attempt will be made to plow PRIORITY TWO County Roads in conjunction with PRIORITY ONE County Road, however, if this cannot be accomplished, PRIORITY TWO County Roads will take precedence over PRIORITY THREE County Roads.

- 6.3 All supervisors and equipment operators are expected to know the areas they are assigned to plow.
- 6.4 Equipment operators are responsible for their equipment and shall inspect this equipment prior to beginning plowing operations to insure it is in proper working order. All malfunctions must be reported to the mechanic. When a vehicle is out of service the supervisor may make vehicle reassignments in order to plow other areas.
- 6.5 Fueling of equipment will occur at the end of each shift to prepare for the next shift's operation. In the event fueling becomes necessary before the end of the shift, such fueling will be staggered to avoid unnecessary congestion at the fuel pumps.
- 6.6 Equipment operators shall obey ALL traffic laws during snow plowing operations.
- 6.7 If an employee for the Fillmore County Roads Department comes upon an abandon vehicle during snow plowing operations, they shall contact the Highway Superintendent or the Roads Foreman. The Highway Superintendent and/or the Roads Foreman with the assistance of the Sheriff's Office will try to locate the owner of such abandoned vehicle to get it moved. If an emergency exist, the Highway Superintendent may instruct the employee to remove the vehicle by using the best method available.
- 6.8 If an employee comes upon a stuck vehicle with occupants and the employee is asked to assist to remove the stuck vehicle, the employee shall contact the Highway Superintendent and/or the Roads Foreman for instructions. The Highway Superintendent and/or the Roads Foreman shall instruct the employee as to what procedure they may take to remove the stuck vehicle. No County Employee shall hook a chain or tow strap/cable to a vehicle without the authorization of the Highway Superintendent and/or the Roads Foreman unless it is a life-threatening situation. The employee shall have the occupant of the stuck vehicle sign a waiver before hooking and towing begin.
- 6.9 Operators who are involved in an accident are required to report the accident immediately to their supervisor and the Sheriff's Department. Operators must also complete an accident report and submit it to their supervisor before the end of their shift.
- 6.10 Operators are required to submit time card reports at the end of each week. Items to be included in these reports are:
 - * date, time and duration of shift
 - * routes plowed on map on back of time card report
 - * breakdowns
 - * any deviations from the assigned route
 - * reason for the deviation
 - * other applicable comments

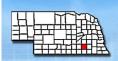
SECTION 7. ADJACENT DRIVEWAYS:

The cleaning of adjacent driveways to County Roads is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. When plowing snow, several passes are sometimes necessary before a County Road is clear. Every effort is made to prevent plowing snow into driveways; however, the Roads Department will not clean driveways adjacent to County Roads. Cleaning driveways that are plowed in by the Roads Department plows is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. It is generally best to open driveways AFTER the snowplows have completed their operations.

SECTION 8. SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM AND SNOW ROUTE MAPS:

A copy of this Snow Removal Program and Policy and Maps indicating all PRIORITY ONE, PRIORITY TWO, PRIORITY THREE, and PRIORITY FOUR County Roads will be kept at the Fillmore County Roads Department, County Courthouse, and Sheriff's Departments.

SECTION 9. CITIZEN COOPERATION:

- 9.1 In order to achieve the best possible result and in the most efficient manner from the Fillmore County Roads Department's snow removal operations, all citizens of Fillmore County are requested to cooperate fully with the Roads Department. During SNOW EMERGENCIES and winter storm conditions, all residents are asked to remove their parked vehicles from all County Roads if possible. This will allow snow plows an opportunity to clear the County Roads quicker and with fewer passes, saving both time and money.
- 9.2 Operating a snowplow can be a frustrating and scary task. When ice creates treacherous driving conditions and high winds blow snow into the driver's view, the snowplows require tremendous skill and courage to operate.

These conditions or motorists driving too quickly can force the snowplow from the road. Motorists driving too fast for conditions can lose control, compromising the driver's safety. This is tragic not only to the driver but to those on the route who's road plowing must be delayed. Motorists should always allow plenty of space near the snowplows and avoid passing whenever possible.

- 9.3 As outlined under SECTION 6. SNOW PLOWING OPERATIONS, 6.7, if a Fillmore County Employee while they are plowing snow comes upon an abandon vehicle that is blocking a county road and must be moved, all attempts will be made to locate the owner to get vehicle removed. If the owner cannot be located and the vehicle must be removed, steps will be taken to move the vehicle. Fillmore County or the employees of Fillmore County cannot be held liable for damages caused by removing the abandoned vehicle.
- 9.3 As outlined under SECTION 6. SNOW PLOWING OPERATIONS, 6.8, if a Fillmore County Employee while they are plowing snow comes upon a stuck vehicle with occupants that is blocking a county road and is asked to assist the owner in removing the stuck vehicle and is instructed by the Highway Superintendent and/or the Roads Foreman to assist, the owner of the stuck vehicle shall make the hookup of the chain or tow strap/cable to their vehicle. Fillmore County or the employees of Fillmore County cannot be held liable for damages caused by assisting a stuck vehicle.

SECTION 10. DEPARTURE FROM POLICY:

Fillmore County acknowledges the policies as set forth in this program are of a general nature and recognizes conditions may be so unusual or unexpected that a departure from this general program may need to be authorized. When conditions warrant, the Fillmore County Highway Superintendent, after consulting with the Fillmore County Sheriff may order a departure from these general policies when conditions are such that the departure from this policy is necessary and warranted for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Fillmore County. The Fillmore County Highway Superintendent or his designee is authorized to publicly announce that non-emergency travel is not recommended when conditions warrant such a warning.

SECTION 11. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:

This policy is not, nor is it intended to encompass all details of Fillmore County's snow removal and control operations.

SECTION 12. POLICY PRIORITY:

To the extent that any previous rule, regulation, policy or past practice, written or unwritten is in conflict with the provisions of this policy, such is hereby withdrawn and voided and all personnel shall conduct themselves in conformity with this policy.
