



January 10, 2012

Reorganization Meeting

The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors convened to reorganize, as required by statute, in open and public session at 9:05 a.m. on January 10, 2012, in the Courthouse Boardroom in Geneva, Nebraska. Members present were Noel, Yates, Simacek, Capek, Mueller, Galusha, and Cerny. The County Clerk was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Notice of the meeting was given by publication. A copy of the publication is on file in the County Clerk's office. All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public. Agenda was approved as presented. The Chairman noted that the public meeting guidelines are posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested. The reorganization meeting adjourned at as 9:32 a.m.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The County Clerk, acting as temporary Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2012. Capek nominated Simacek and Yates nominated Cerny. Mueller moved and Capek seconded that the nominations cease and that a paper ballot be cast.

After poll vote, the temporary Chairman stated Simacek will be the 2012 Chairman by a vote of 4 to 3 and Simacek assumed the Chair.

ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIRMAN

Chairman Simacek asked for nominations for Vice-Chairman. Yates nominated Noel. Mueller moved and Capek seconded the motion that nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast.

The Chairman declared that Noel would be Vice-Chairman of the Board for 2012.

NAMING OFFICIAL BANK DEPOSITORIES

Yates moved and Noel seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2012-01

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the First National Bank of Exeter, the Geneva State Bank of Geneva, Shickley, Grafton, and Fairmont, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, and the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan, are hereby designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.

AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS

Mueller moved and Yates seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2012-02

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be authorized to invest the surplus funds of said county in United States Government Bonds, United States Treasury Notes, Bills or Certificates of Indebtedness maturing within two years of the date of purchase; and in Certificates of Deposit, or Money Market Savings Accounts.





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Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

The Chairman declared the resolution adopted.

DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

Noel moved and Galusha seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2012-03

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capital stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2012, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$100,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

GRAFTON NW BRIDGE PROJECT

WHEREAS, certain transportation facilities in Fillmore County, Nebraska, have been designated as being eligible for Federal-Aid transportation funds by the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads (NDOR) in compliance with Federal laws pertaining thereto; and

WHEREAS, Fillmore County has previously entered into Agreements (Programs) with NDOR, for said Federal-Aid transportation funds for improvements on these transportation facilities; and





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WHEREAS, these projects are not included in NDOR's current long-range plan of projects; and

WHEREAS, the State of Nebraska, Department of Roads, recommends that Fillmore County withdraw these projects and cancel all agreements pertaining to such projects; and

WHEREAS, the State of Nebraska agrees to not seek reimbursement of State costs incurred on such projects.

BE IT RESOLVED: that Fillmore County is hereby requesting that the Nebraska Department of Roads withdraw the following projects from the Federal Aid list. Those projects are described as:

Mark Timmerman, Highway Superintendent informed the Board that he would be submitting the application to the State Fire Marshal for the new fuel tank at the Shickley shop.

Per Board request the County Clerk, Amy Nelson presented current budget figures as of December 31, 2011 for the Road Department. The Board and Highway Superintendent discussed options of what projects should be completed first. The Board requested to review the budget figures again the end of March.

"OLD" HOSPITAL DISCUSSION

Patt Lentfer, Director of the Fillmore County Development Corp. informed the Board that NPPD would not list the "old" Hospital site as premium if there was not a price listed.





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After discussion, the Board split the hospital up into three different sections with prices and then a price for the entire location.

MOBILE COMMAND CENTER

Donna Mainwaring, Emergency Manager informed the Board that the County has received \$20,000.00 from the Southeast Region for radio/paging equipment for the mobile command center. The County would need to make all the purchases and install the equipment prior to getting reimbursed. Donna has received one quote and waiting to receive a couple more.

After discussion, Yates moved and Capek seconded the motion to allow the emergency manager to purchase the equipment needed for the mobile command center not to exceed the funds received from the Southeast Region. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

RESOLUTION 2012-11

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS (THE "COUNTY BOARD") OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA (THE "COUNTY"), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Chairperson and members of the County Board hereby find and determine: that the County owns and operates a hospital, including real and personal property, as provided in Section 23-3501, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, which is known as Fillmore County Hospital (the "Facility"); that it is necessary and advisable that the County acquire certain equipment for the Facility described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto (the "Equipment"); that pursuant to Section 23-3114, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, the County Board has the power and authority to enter into contracts for lease of real or personal property for authorized purposes; that such leases are not restricted to a single year and may provide for the purchase of property in installment payments; that the acquisition of the Equipment for the Facility is an authorized purpose; that pursuant to Section 23-3553, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, the Board of Trustees of the Hospital (the "Hospital Board") may establish depreciation funds (the "Fund") from patient or other revenue income for the purpose of purchasing equipment; that it is necessary and advisable for the County to provide for the financing of the Equipment over a period of years through a lease-purchase agreement with GE Government Finance, Inc., or an affiliate (the "Lessor") in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit "B" (the "Agreement"); that it the understanding of this County Board that the Hospital Board has or will establish the Fund in amounts from time to time sufficient to satisfy the obligations of the County under the Agreement (although it is also understood that amounts on deposit in the Fund are not pledged for payment of amounts due under the Agreement and may be used for any lawful purpose, and any amounts on deposit in the Fund which are expected to be used to make payments under the agreement shall in no event exceed the amount permitted to be maintained in a "bona fide debt service fund" as defined in Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and related regulations); and that all conditions, acts and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to entering into the Agreement for acquisition of the Equipment by the County for the Facility do exist and have been done as required by law.

Section 2. The County is hereby authorized to enter into the Agreement (as approved by the County Attorney and executed as provided in Section 3 below), and provide the payment of up to \$225,000 for the purchase price attributable to such Equipment to be payable in rental payments over a period of approximately five (5) years with interest (computed at a per annum rate not to exceed four percent (4%)), as lease-purchase rentals. The Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form presented at this meeting, subject to the provisions of Section 3 below. It is hereby determined that the Agreement and the County's obligations thereunder shall be issued and delivered by the County to the Lessor as the County's lease-purchase obligation pursuant to and as described in Section 23-3114, R.R.S. Neb. 2007.

Section 3. The execution and delivery of the Agreement by the County is hereby authorized and approved by the County Board subject to the further approval by the County Attorney of Exhibit B and any attachments. Subject to the approval of Exhibit B by the County Attorney, the Chairperson of the County Board and County Clerk of the County are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver on behalf of the County said Agreement, including necessary counterparts, in substantially the form and content as presented to this meeting, but with such changes or modifications therein as to them seem necessary, desirable or appropriate for and on behalf of the County and subject to the approval of the County Attorney.

Section 4. That the Treasurer of the County is hereby appointed as registrar for the Agreement and shall keep books and records for such registration at the offices of the County in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.

Section 5. That the County Board hereby states that it is the intention of the County that the amount of basic rent due under said Agreement attributable to interest under the Agreement shall be excludable from the gross income of the registered owner thereof under the Federal Income Tax by virtue of Section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and sections related thereto, and the Chairperson of the County Board, County Clerk and County Treasurer each are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary and appropriate to carry out said intention.

Section 6. Subject to the approval of the final form of the Agreement by County Attorney and execution thereof as provided in Section 3 above, the County Board hereby agrees, in accordance with the terms of the Agreement, that it shall make appropriations for payment of rental payment under the Agreement, as provided to and subject to the terms of the Agreement, for the purpose of paying and sufficient to make all payments under the Agreement as and when such payments become due according to the terms thereof. It is the understanding of the County that the source of funds for such appropriations will be the Fund established by the Hospital Board or such other funds as may be made available by the Hospital. The County further covenants and agrees that it will during the term of such agreement observe and comply with the terms of the Agreement in such manner that a monies shall be lawfully available to pay all rentals due under said Agreement.

Section 7. That all actions previously taken by the County Board in connection with ordering the Equipment subject to said Agreement (as approved by the County Attorney and executed as provided in Section 3 above) for any items of such equipment be and they are hereby confirmed and ratified in all respects.

Section 8. That this resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its adoption.

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county covering the delinquent taxes upon such parcels for real estate, to be foreclosed in the manner provided in Section 77-1901 to 77-1918, Nebraska Revised Statutes.

WHEREAS, more than two consecutive years have elapsed upon real estate which has been offered for sale and not sold for want of bidders; and

WHEREAS, more than three years will have elapsed since the issuance of such respective certificates of tax sale and by reason thereof the right of redemption of the owners or claimants of such respective tract has expired;

BE IT NOW RESOLVED, that the County Board shall direct the County Attorney to commence foreclosure on such liens or certificates on all real estate which has heretofore been advertised and offered for sale and remains unsold for want of bidders and certificates of tax sale issued thereupon.

RESOLUTION 2012 – 41

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF COUNTY BUILDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA, IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$815,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COSTS OF CONSTRUCTING A BUILDING FOR THE COUNTY; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS; PROVIDING FOR A SINKING FUND AND FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES TO PAY SAID BONDS; PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER; AND PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF THE BOND PROCEEDS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FILLMORE COUNTY, NEBRASKA, as follows:

Section 1. The County Board of Supervisors finds and determines; that it is necessary and advisable for the County to construct a building for the County pursuant to Section 23-120, R.R. S. Neb. (Supp. 2010) ("Section 23-120"); that the County presently has no bonds outstanding under Section 23-120; that for the purpose of paying the cost of said building and improvements and equipment, it is necessary for the County to issue its negotiable bonds in the principal amount of \$815,000; that at the time of the adoption of this resolution the County of Fillmore has less than 6,000 inhabitants and the 2011-12 taxable valuation of the County was \$1,221,989,974; that the annual levy authorized under Section 23-120(3)(b), R.\$.S. Supp. 2010, is and will be sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds authorized herein; and that all conditions, acts and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to the issuance of bonds of the County in the amount of \$815,000 do exist and have been done and performed in regular and due form and time as required by law.

Section 2. For the purposes as described in Section 1 above, there shall be and there hereby are ordered issued County Building Bonds, of the principal amount of \$815,000, to bear date of original issue of September 18, 2012, and to be in fully registered form. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rates per annum and mature on June 15 of each year in the principal amounts as follows:

The bonds shall be issued in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof and shall be numbered from 1 upwards in the order of their issuance. No bond shall be issued originally or upon transfer or partial redemption having more than one principal maturity. The initial bond numbering and principal amounts for each of the bonds issued shall be as directed by the initial purchasers thereof. Interest on the bonds shall be payable semiannually on December 15 and June 15 of each year, starting December 15, 2012. The interest due on each interest payment date shall be payable to the registered owners of record as of the close of business on the last day of the calendar month immediately preceding the calendar month in which the interest payment date occurs (the "Record Date"), subject to the provisions of Section 3 hereof. Payment of interest due on the bonds prior to maturity or redemption shall be made by the Paying Agent and Registrar, as designated pursuant to Section 3 hereof, by mailing a check in the amount due for such interest on each interest payment date to the registered owner of each bond, as of the applicable Record Date, to such owner's registered address as shown on the books of registration, as required to be maintained in Section 3 hereof. Payment of principal due at maturity or at any date fixed for redemption, together with any accrued interest then due, shall be made by said Paying Agent and Registrar to the registered owners upon presentation and surrender of the bonds to said Paying Agent and Registrar. In the event that bonds of this issue are held in the nominee name of a national clearinghouse or depository, payment of principal or interest shall be made by wire transfer of funds in accordance with any applicable regulations governing "Depository Eligible Securities". The County and said Paying Agent and Registrar may treat the registered owner of any bond as the absolute owner of such bond for the purpose of making payments thereon and for all other purposes and neither the County nor said Paying Agent and Registrar shall be affected by any notice or knowledge to the contrary whether such bond or any installment of interest due thereon shall be overdue or not. All payments on account of interest or principal made to the registered owner of any bond shall be valid and effectual and shall be a discharge of the County and said Paying Agent and Registrar, in respect of the liability upon the bonds or claims for interest to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. If any bond is not paid upon presentation of the bond at maturity or any interest installment is not paid when due, the delinquent bond or delinquent interest installment shall bear interest thereafter until paid at a rate equal to the rate assessed against delinquent taxes under Section 45-104.01 R.R.S. Nebraska, 2010, as now existing or as the same may be amended from time to time by the Nebraska Legislature.

Section 3. The County Treasurer, is hereby designated as Paying Agent and Registrar for the bonds. Said Paying Agent and Registrar shall keep and maintain for the County books for the registration and transfer of the bonds at the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar in Geneva, Nebraska. The names and registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the bonds shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any bond may be transferred pursuant to its provisions at the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar upon surrender of such bond for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to such Paying Agent and Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by such owner's duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Paying Agent and Registrar will register such transfer upon said registration books and deliver to the transferee registered owner or owners (or send by registered mail to the transferee owner or owners at such owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of such transferee owner or owners, a new bond or bonds of the same interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the bonds by this resolution, one bond may be transferred for several such bonds of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such bonds may be transferred for one or several such bonds, respectively, of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a bond, the surrendered bond or bonds shall be cancelled and destroyed. All bonds issued upon transfer of the bonds so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the County evidencing the same obligations as the bonds surrendered and shall be entitled to all benefits and protection of this resolution to the same extent as the bonds upon transfer of which they were delivered. The County and the Paying Agent and Registrar shall not be required to transfer bonds during any period from any Record Date until its immediately following interest payment date or to transfer any bonds called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption prior to maturity. In the event that payments of interest due on the bonds on an interest payment date are not timely made, such interest shall cease to be payable to the registered owners as of the Record Date for such interest payment date and shall be payable to the registered owners of the bonds as of a special date of record for payment of such defaulted interest as shall be designated by the Paying Agent and Registrar whenever monies for the purpose of paying such defaulted interest become available.

Section 4. Bonds maturing on or after June 15, 2018 shall be subject to redemption, in whole or in part, prior to maturity at any time on or after the fifth anniversary of the date of original issue of the Bonds, at par plus accrued interest on the principal amount redeemed to the date fixed for redemption. Bonds shall be redeemed only in the amount of





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\$5,000 or integral multiples thereof. Any Bond redeemed in part only shall be surrendered to the Paying Agent and Registrar in exchange for a new Bond evidencing the unredeemed principal thereof. Notice of redemption of any Bond called for redemption shall be given, at the direction of the Chairperson and Board in the case of optional redemption and without further direction in the case of mandatory redemption, by the Paying Agent and Registrar by mail not less than thirty days prior to the date fixed for redemption, first class postage prepaid, sent to the registered owner of such Bond at said owner's registered address. Such notice shall designate the Bond or Bonds to be redeemed by number and maturity, the date of original issue, the date fixed for redemption and state that such Bond or Bonds are to be presented for prepayment at the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar. In case of any Bond partially redeemed, such notice shall specify the portion of the principal amount of such Bond to be redeemed. No defect in the mailing of notice for any Bond shall affect the sufficiency of the proceedings of the Chairperson and Board designating the Bonds called for redemption or the effectiveness of such call for Bonds for which notice by mail has been properly given and the Chairperson and Board shall have the right to further direct notice of redemption for any such Bond for which defective notice has been given.

Section 5. If the date for payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds shall be a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or a day on which banking institutions in the city where the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive order to close, then the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or a day on which such banking institutions are authorized to close, and payment on such day shall have the same force and effect as if made on the nominal date of payment.

Section 6. The bonds shall be executed on behalf of the County by being signed by the Chairperson and the County Clerk, both of which signatures may be facsimile signatures, and shall have the County seal (or a facsimile thereof) impressed on each bond. The County Clerk shall make and certify a transcript of proceedings had and done precedent to the issuance of said bonds which shall be delivered to the purchaser of said bonds. After being executed by the Chairperson and County Clerk, said bonds shall be delivered to the Treasurer of the County who shall be responsible therefor under his/her official bond. Such Treasurer shall maintain a record of information with respect to said bonds in accordance with the requirements of Section 10-140, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, and shall cause the same to be filed with the Auditor of Public Accounts of the State of Nebraska. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall register each bond in the name of its initial registered owner as designated by the initial purchaser. Each bond shall be authenticated on behalf of the County by the Paying Agent and Registrar. The bonds shall be issued initially as "book-entry only" bonds using the services of The Depository Trust Company (the "Depository"), with one typewritten bond per maturity being issued to the Depository. In such connection said officers of the County are authorized to execute and deliver a letter of representations and inducement (the "Letter of Representations") in the form required by the Depository, for and on behalf of the County (including any blanket letter previously executed), which shall thereafter govern matters with respect to registration, transfer, payment and redemption of the bonds. Upon issuance of the bonds as "book-entry-only" bonds, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) The County and the Paying Agent and Registrar shall have no responsibility or obligation to any broker-dealer, bank or other financial institution for which the Depository holds bonds as securities depository (each, a "Bond Participant") or to any person who is an actual purchaser of a bond from a Bond Participant while the bonds are in book-entry form (each a "Beneficial Owner") with respect to the following:
 - (i) the accuracy of the records of the Depository, any nominees of the Depository or any Bond Participant with respect to any ownership interest in the bonds;
 - (ii) the delivery to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any notice with respect to the bonds, including any notice of redemption, or
 - (iii) the payment to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any amount with respect to the bonds. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall make payments with respect to the bonds only to or upon the order of the Depository or its nominee, and all such payments shall be valid and effective fully to satisfy and discharge the obligations with respect to such bonds to the extent of





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the sum or sums so paid. No person other than the Depository shall receive an authenticated Bond, except as provided in (e) below.

- (b) Upon receipt by the Paying Agent and Registrar of written notice from the Depository to the effect that the Depository is unable to or unwilling to discharge its responsibilities, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange bonds requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts. Whenever the Depository requests the Paying Agent and Registrar to do so, the Paying Agent and Registrar will cooperate with the Depository in taking appropriate action after reasonable notice (i) to arrange, with the prior written consent of the County, for a substitute depository willing and able upon reasonable and customary terms to maintain custody of the bonds or (ii) to make available bonds registered in whatever name or names the Beneficial Owners transferring or exchanging such bonds shall designate.
- (c) If the County determines that it is desirable that certificates representing the bonds be delivered to the ultimate Beneficial Owners of the bonds and so notifies the Paying Agent and Registrar in writing, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall so notify the Depository, whereupon the Depository will notify the Bond Participants of the availability through the Depository of bond certificates representing the bonds. In such event, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates representing the bonds as requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts and in authorized denominations.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution to the contrary, so long as any bond is registered in the name of the Depository or any nominee thereof, all payments with respect to such bond and all notices with respect to such bond shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository as provided in the Letter of Representations.
- (e) Registered ownership of the bonds may be transferred on the books of registration maintained by the Paying Agent and Registrar, and the bonds may be delivered in physical form to the following:
 - (i) any successor securities depository or its nominee; or
 - (ii) any person, upon (A) the resignation of the Depository from its functions as depository or (B) termination of the use of the Depository pursuant to this Section and the terms of the Paying Agent and Registrar's Agreement.
- (f) In the event of any partial redemption of a bond unless and until such partially redeemed bond has been replaced in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, the books and records of the Paying Agent and Registrar shall govern and establish the principal amount of such bond as is then outstanding and all of the bonds issued to the Depository or its nominee shall contain a legend to such effect.

If for any reason the Depository resigns and is not replaced or upon termination by the County of book-entry-only form, the County shall immediately provide a supply of bond certificates for issuance upon subsequent transfers or in the event of partial redemption. In the event that such supply of certificates shall be insufficient to meet the requirements of the Paying Agent and Registrar for issuance of replacement bond certificates upon transfer or partial redemption, the County agrees to order printed an additional supply of bond certificates and to direct their execution by manual or facsimile signature of its then duly qualified and acting officers. In case any officer whose signature or facsimile thereof shall appear on any bond shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such bond (including any bond certificates delivered to the Paying Agent and Registrar for issuance upon transfer or partial redemption) such signature or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes the same as if such officer or officers had remained in office until the delivery of such bond. The bonds shall not be valid and binding on the County until authenticated by the Paying Agent and Registrar. The bonds shall be delivered to the Paying Agent and Registrar for registration and authentication.

BUILDING IN A FLOODPLAIN

After discussion with the landowner Robbie Petersen the Board was informed that he has contacted the surveying firm and they are sending all the necessary paperwork to FEMA to see if they can amend the floodplain maps with the corrected elevation. The Board requested that he send all documentation to the Planning and Zoning office and to stop building. Also in attendance were Deputy County Attorney, Howard Ach, Pat Lentfer, and Heather Miller.

OLD HOSPITAL DISCUSSION

At the last Board meeting Hugh Wilkins informed the Board that his sister Beth Wilkins would be interested in renting the South wing of the old hospital.
