Reorganization Meeting

The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors convened to reorganize, as required by statute, in open and public session at 9:07 a.m. on January 7, 2014, in the Courthouse Boardroom in Geneva, Nebraska. Members present were Capek, Yates, Galusha, Cerny, Mueller, Neiman, and Noel. The County Clerk was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Notice of the meeting was given by publication. A copy of the publication is on file in the County Clerk's office. All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public. Agenda was approved as presented. The Chairman noted that the public meeting guidelines are posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested. The reorganization meeting adjourned at 9:44 a.m.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The County Clerk, acting as temporary Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m. The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2014. Nelson called for nominations for Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Mueller nominated Cerny.

Moved by Yates and seconded by Mueller that the nominations cease and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Cerny as Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the Generations Bank, the Geneva State Bank of Geneva, Shickley, Grafton, and Fairmont, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, and the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan, are hereby designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.

DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

Mueller moved and Neiman seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2014-03

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capital stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2014, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one

time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$250,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

RESOLUTION 2014-05

WHEREAS, Section 23-1114 of the Revised Reissue Statutes of Nebraska (1987) provides that the salary of elected officers of Fillmore County shall be set by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors for a four-year term prior to January 15, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the following annual salaries be established.

- 1. The annual salary for the office of the County Board of Supervisors shall be established at \$16,637.96 for the calendar year 2015, plus an annual 3% increase during the term of office (2016, 2017, and 2018).
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the annual salary for the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors shall be established at \$1,000.00 more a year than the County Board.
- 2. The annual salary for the office of the County Clerk shall be established at \$46,801.67 for the calendar year 2015, plus an annual 3% increase during the term of office (2016, 2017, and 2018).
- 3. The annual salary for the office of County Treasurer shall be established at \$46,801.67 for the calendar year 2015, plus an annual 3% increase during the term of office (2016, 2017, and 2018).
- 4. The annual salary for the office of County Assessor shall be established at \$46,801.67 for the calendar year 2015, plus an annual 3% increase during the term of office (2016, 2017, and 2018).
- 5. The annual salary for the office of County Clerk of District Court shall be established at \$44,518.65 for the year 2015, \$47,189.77 for the year 2016, \$49,077.36 for the year 2017 and \$51,141.45 for the year 2018 during the term of office.
- 6. The annual salary for the office of County Sheriff shall be established at \$57,645.96 for the calendar year 2015, plus an annual 3% increase during the term of office (2016, 2017, and 2018).
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that if the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Geneva for Law Enforcement should no longer exist, then the annual salary for the County Sheriff will be established at 120% of the Clerk, Assessor, and Treasurer's annual salary.
- 7. The annual salary for the office of County Attorney shall be established at \$52,395.04 for the calendar year 2015, plus an annual 3% increase during the term of office (2016, 2017, and 2018).
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the annual salary for the office of Deputy County Attorney be established at 65% of the County Attorney's annual salary.
- 8. The annual salary for the budget making authority shall be established at \$2,000.00 for the calendar year 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the offices of Assessor, Clerk, Clerk of District Court, Sheriff, and Treasurer are full time; Attorney and Board of Supervisors are part-time positions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that each of the above designated elected officials shall receive during their term of office, individual health with prescription drug card, life insurance at County expense, and that each of the above designated elected officials shall be entitled to benefit and participate, during the term of office in Fillmore County retirement plan pursuant to the county employees retirement act, the same being the benefits that are currently extended to the county employees generally, in the event additional fringe benefits are subsequently extended to county employees generally, the above designated elected officials shall be entitled to benefit and receive such additional fringe benefits.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if notice of the same be necessary, the county reserves the right to enter into any program for the benefit of employees of the county, any other programs as may be approved, with the right of elected officials and deputies granted to participate in such programs on the effective date of such programs as approved by the Board. It is the intent of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that participation in such programs shall not constitute an increase in the herein adopted salary but shall be and is part of such salary as adopted by this resolution.

WHEREAS, more than two consecutive years have elapsed upon real estate which has been offered for sale and not sold for want of bidders; and

WHEREAS, more than three years will have elapsed since the issuance of such respective certificates of tax sale and by reason thereof the right of redemption of the owners or claimants of such respective tract has expired;

BE IT NOW RESOLVED, that the County Board shall direct the County Attorney to commence foreclosure on such liens or certificates on all real estate which has heretofore been advertised and offered for sale and remains unsold for want of bidders and certificates of tax sale issued thereupon.

WHEREAS, the various counties, communities, and agencies within those jurisdictions desire to make the most efficient use of the power by enabling them to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities in the manner pursuant to forms of governmental organization that will accord best with geographic, economic, population, and other factors; and

WHEREAS, an interlocal agreement, consistent with Nebraska Revised Statutes 13-801 et.seq, would be in the best interest of all participating agencies; and

WHEREAS, the agencies desire to enter into a written interlocal agreement for the purposes of carrying out the RAP objectives and grant requirements of the Nebraska Crime Commission.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the County of Fillmore authorizes William Burgess, County Sheriff to enter the County of Fillmore into an interlocal agreement for joint and cooperative action pursuant to the provisions of Section 13-801 through 13-807 of Nebraska Revised Statutes. The interlocal agreement shall be for the strict administration of the RAP project and all funds allocated by the Nebraska Crime Commission, and match dollars allocated by the RAP members. Further, this interlocal agreement shall not establish a separate legal entity, rather as a joint and cooperative undertaking between public agencies i.e. state, county, city, and village. (Nebraska Revised Statute 13-801).

Amount of match dollars allocated by the County of Fillmore for the 2014-2015 grant period (RAP 25) will be \$4,328.25.

RESOLUTION 2014 - 23

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE COUNTY'S ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$12,000,000 FOR THE PURPOSES OF FINANCING THE COSTS OF PAVING AND IMPROVING CERTAIN HIGHWAYS AND ROADS OF THE COUNTY AND THE LEVY OF A SPECIAL TAX TO PAY SUCH BONDS, WHICH TAX MAY EXCEED THE CONSTITUTIONAL LEVY LIMITATION OF FIFTY CENTS PER ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS OF TAXABLE VALUE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THIS PROPOSITION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE COUNTY FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION AT A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 4, 2014; AND TO PROVIDE THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "**Board**") of the County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "**County**"), following careful and diligent examination of the matter, has determined that it is necessary for the County to pave and improve certain highways and roads of the County, including paving Road 24 from Highway 6 to Highway 41 (Milligan North), and related improvements (the "**Project**"), that the proposed Project will cost at least \$12,000,000, and that the Board must borrow money by issuing the bonds of the County to pay for the proposed Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized by Chapters 23, 39 and 64, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, to borrow money and issue the bonds of the County to undertake such Project and to levy a tax upon the taxable value of all the taxable property of the County to pay the costs of the proposed Project, including any bonds issued for such purpose; and

WHEREAS, such tax levy may not exceed the rate of 50 cents per one hundred dollars of the taxable value of all the taxable property in the County without first submitting the proposition to a vote of the people of the County at a special election ordered by the Board for that purpose and obtaining the approval of a majority of the legal voters thereon; and

WHEREAS, a proposition for the issuance of bonds in connection with the Project has not been submitted to the electors of the County within six months preceding the date of the special election called by this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds it necessary to submit to a vote of the qualified electors of the County at a special election to be held in conjunction with the statewide general election on Tuesday, November 4, 2014 the proposition of whether the County shall issue its general obligation bonds to pay the costs of the Project and levy a special tax to pay the principal of, any premium, and the interest on the Bonds in excess of the County's statutory and Constitutional levy limitations of 50 cents per one hundred dollars of taxable value.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

The Board hereby directs and calls for a special election to be held in conjunction with the statewide general election on Tuesday, November 4, 2014 (the "**Election**"), at which time there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the County the following proposition::

"Shall the County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "County") issue its bonds in a total principal amount not to exceed \$12,000,000 for the purpose of financing the costs of paving and improving certain highways and roads of the County, including paving Road 24 from Highway 6 to Highway 41 (Milligan North), and related improvements; said bonds to be issued from time to time, to be sold at such prices, to bear interest at such rate or rates, to become due at such time or times, and to have such other terms and provisions, all as may be fixed and determined by the Board of Supervisors of the County; and

"Shall the County cause to be levied and collected annually a special levy of taxes against all the taxable property in the County, in addition to all other taxes to be collected by the County, sufficient in rate and amount to pay the principal of, the premium, if any, and the interest on said bonds as the same become due; provided, however, that such special levy of taxes shall not exceed the County's constitutional and statutory limitations upon the levying of taxes by greater than four and one-half (4.5) cents for each \$100 of taxable valuation and shall not be levied and collected for more than 20 years?"



Electors voting in favor of said proposition shall blacken completely the oval opposite the words "FOR said bonds and tax" following said proposition, and electors voting against said proposition shall blacken completely the oval opposite the words "AGAINST said bonds and tax" following said proposition.

The County Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Election Commissioner of the County no later than September 1, 2014.

The Election shall be conducted in accordance with Sections 23-125 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Act"), and Sections 32-101 et seq., Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended (the "Election Act"), and may be conducted by mail in accordance with Sections 32-952 through 32-960 of said Election Act. The Election Commissioner shall conduct the Election on the question herein presented in all respects the same as other County elections and in the manner provided by law.

As required by Section 32-802 of the Election Act, the Election Commissioner, no later than 40 days prior to the date of the Election, shall provide for publication of notice of the Election and posting of such notice in the office of the Election Commissioner. The County Clerk, pursuant Section 23-126, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, shall publish, or shall cause to be published, notice of the Election in the *Nebraska Signal*, being a legal newspaper of general circulation in the County, one time each week for four consecutive weeks, the first such publication occurring at least 20 days prior to the Election. The form of such notice of the Election shall be substantially in the form submitted to this meeting, a copy of which form shall be made a part of the minutes.

The County Clerk shall furnish the final form of the ballot on the question presented herein to the Election Commissioner no later than 25 days prior to the date of the Election (or such earlier date as may be requested by the Election Commissioner). The form of ballot shall be substantially in the form submitted to this meeting (with any changes as may be required by the Election Commissioner), a copy of which form shall be made a part of the minutes. As required by Section 32-803 of the Election Act, the Election Commissioner shall publish, or shall cause to be published, the form of the sample ballot in the *Nebraska Signal*, being a legal newspaper of general circulation in the County, one time not more than 15 days nor less than 2 days prior to the Election.

This resolution shall be and constitutes an order entered of record as contemplated by Section 23-125 of the Act.

The Chair of the Board or the County Clerk is each hereby authorized and directed, in conjunction with the Election Commissioner, to do all other things and take all other action appropriate or necessary in order to cause said proposition to be submitted to the qualified electors of the County as above provided.

RESOLUTION 2014-32

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA, (THE "COUNTY") THAT:

- Section 1. The Chairperson and Board of Supervisors (the "County Board") of the County hereby finds and determines that the Board of Trustees of Fillmore County Hospital (the "Hospital"), a county hospital organized pursuant to Section 23-3501 et. Seq., Neb. R.R.S. 2012, has authorized the development, construction and equipping of a new behavioral inpatient and outpatient facility (the "Project") at an estimated cost of \$5,010,200, and that the Hospital plans to finance the Project by issuing indebtedness secured by a pledge of the Hospital's revenues.
- Section 2. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 23-3504, Neb. R.R.S. 2012, the County Board hereby (a) approves the Project, (b) approves the financing and refinancing of the Project through debt obligations, in one or more series, issued or incurred by the Hospital and secured by a mortgage (which may be in the form of a deed of trust) and pledge of the revenues of the Hospital in such total principal amount as determined appropriate by the Hospital, not in excess of \$5,010,200 (the "Financing"), and (c) covenants and agrees that all or substantially all of the facilities and property of the Hospital will not be sold, leased, exchanged, encumbered or disposed of to the extent prohibited under the terms of the Financing.
- Section 3. The County Board hereby designates the Financing, in the calendar year or years issued, as the County's "qualified tax-exempt obligations" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Code and authorizes and directs the County Clerk to execute and deliver such certificates, documents and agreements related to such designation as may be requested by the Hospital in connection with the Financing. In addition, the County Board hereby represents that:
 - the aggregate face amount of all tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds which are not "qualified 501©(3) bonds") which will be issued by the County (and all subordinate entities thereof) during the calendar year or years in which the Financing occurs is not reasonably expected to exceed \$10,000,000; and

the County (including all subordinate entities thereof) will not issue an aggregate principal amount of obligations designated by the County to be "qualified tax-exempt obligations" during the calendar year or years in which the Financing occurs, including the Financing, in excess of \$10,000,000, without first obtaining an opinion of bond counsel that the designation of the Financing as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" will not be adversely affected.

Section 4. This resolution shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.

CLOSURE OF PORTIONS OF ROAD IN GENEVA TOWNSHIP

Yates moved and Noel seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2014 - 33

WHEREAS, pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1722, the County Board of Fillmore County, Nebraska, may, by resolution when it deems the public interest may require vacation or abandonment of a public road of the County, and may direct the County Highway Superintendent to study the use being made of such public road and to submit in writing to the County Board his recommendation as to the vacation or abandonment thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, directed the above referenced study to be made and such study was made with regard to Sections twenty-seven (27), twenty-eight (28), thirty-three (33), and thirty-four (34), Township seven (7) North, Range three (3) West of the 6th P.M. in Fillmore County, Nebraska, and directed that the County Highway Superintendent submit in writing to the County Board within thirty days, a report upon the study made and his recommendation as to the vacation or abandonment thereof and directed that such report be retained in the office of the County Clerk of Fillmore County, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute §39-1724, has the authority to adopt a resolution fixing the time, date, and place for a public hearing upon receipt of the above referenced study and publish such resolution once a week for three consecutive weeks in a legal newspaper published in the County and cause copies to be served by registered or certified mail upon the owners of land abutting on or adjacent to the road to be vacated or abandoned by mailing the same to the last known address of each owner not less than two weeks in advance of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, adopted the above referenced Resolution and complied with Nebraska Revised Statutes §39-1722 and §39-1724.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Fillmore, have by a vote of two-thirds of more voted to vacate portions of the roadway running east and west between Sections twenty-seven (27) and thirty-four (34) and Sections twenty-eight (28) & thirty-three (33), Township seven (7) North, Range three (3) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Fillmore County, Nebraska.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, upon a vote of at least two-thirds of all members, deems that the public interest and public good, require the abandonment of the above referenced roadway and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fillmore County Board does hereby vacate portions of the roadway running east and west between Sections twenty-seven (27) and thirty-four (34) and Sections twenty-eight (28) & thirty-three (33), Township seven (7) North, Range three (3) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Fillmore County, Nebraska, and that the ownership of the vacated portion of the roadway of said Sections twenty-seven (27) and thirty-four (34) and Sections twenty-eight (28) & thirty-three (33) is hereby awarded and does hereby revert to the following persons:

- 1. The South half of said vacated roadway abutting the NW ¼ of the NW ¼ of Section 34, T7N,R3W shall become the sole and separate property of AgriMars LLC and Jan E. and Patrick J. O'Brien.
- 2. The North half of said vacated roadway abutting the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ of section 27, T7N, R3W shall become the sole and separate property of Virginia A. Richards.
- 3. The North half of said vacated roadway abutting the East 954 ft. of the SE ¼ of section 28, T7N-R3W shall become the sole and separate property of Helen Waring Johnson.
- 4. The North half of said vacated roadway abutting the West 1666 feet of the SE ¼ of section 28, T7N-R3W shall become the sole and separate property of Robert B. Waring, Jr.
- 5. The North half of said vacated roadway abutting the SE ¼ of the SW ¼ of section 28, T7N,-R3W shall become the sole and separate property of Robert B. Waring Jr.
- 6. The South half of said vacated roadway abutting the NE ¼ of section 33, T7N-R3W shall become the sole and separate property of Dale E. and Jeanette A. Stengel.
- 7. The South half of said vacated roadway abutting the NE ¼ of the NW ¼ of section 33, T7N, R3W shall become the said and separate property of Kenneth W. Lefever, trustee of the Kenneth W. Lefever First Trust and Sandra L. Lefever, trustee of the Sandra L. Lefever First Trust.

That the owners of said vacated roadway are being awarded the portions of the vacated road upon the following conditions:

- The bridge located between Sections twenty-seven (27) and thirty-four (34) will be removed by Fillmore County.
- 2. It shall be the sole responsibility of Fillmore County to maintain barricades at the
- 3. If the respective landowners are desirous of determining the exact center of the vacated road or the portion of the vacated road which each shall own following the vacation of said, then it shall be the responsibility and expense of the seven landowners to conduct a survey in order to resolve that issue.
- 4. It shall be the sole responsibility of the respective landowners to maintain a gate at the east and west ends of the vacated roadway in order to prevent usage roadway by any person other than the record owners of the vacated roadway and their guests.
- 5. It shall be the sole responsibility of the respective landowners heretofore described to notify their liability insurance carriers of their acquisition of the vacated portion of the roadway so as to provide said insurance carriers with knowledge that said vacated roadway is now owned by the respective owners for purposes of liability insurance coverage.
- 6. The County shall have no responsibility or liability with regard to the maintenance of the vacated roadway or with respect to placing barricades at the east and west end of said vacated roadway.
