



Reorganization Meeting

The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors convened to reorganize, as required by statute, in open and public session at 9:40 a.m. on January 5, 2017, in the Courthouse Boardroom in Geneva, Nebraska. Members present were Noel, Sluka, Galusha, Cerny, Mueller, Neiman, and Johnson. The Deputy County Clerk was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Notice of the meeting was given by publication. A copy of the publication is on file in the County Clerk's office. All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public. Agenda was approved as presented. The Chairman noted that the public meeting guidelines are posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested. The reorganization meeting adjourned at 10:26 a.m.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2017. Deputy County Clerk called for nominations for Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Johnson nominated Mueller, and Mueller nominated Neiman. With no other nominations, Noel moved and Johnson seconded that nominations cease and that a paper ballot be conducted. Vote for Neiman was four (4) and for Mueller was three (3).

Noel moved and Cerny seconded the motion that Jeff Neiman be elected as Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

Ayes: Neiman, Noel, Cerny, Mueller, Galusha, and Sluka Nays: Johnson

The Deputy County Clerk as acting temporary Chairman declared the motion carried.

The Deputy County Clerk announced that Jeff Neiman has been elected as Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors and turned the meeting over to the Chairman.

ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIRMAN

Chairman Neiman called for nominations for Vice-Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Johnson nominated Mueller and Mueller nominated Noel. With no other nominations, Johnson moved and Mueller seconded that nominations cease and that a paper ballot be conducted. Vote for Noel was four (4) and for Mueller was three (3).

Cerny moved and Mueller seconded the motion that Merle Noel be elected as Vice-Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

Ayes: Cerny, Mueller, Galusha, Sluka, and Neiman Nays: Johnson Abstaining: Noel

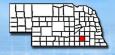
The Chairman declared that Merle Noel would be Vice-Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors.

NAMING OFFICIAL BANK DEPOSITORIES

Johnson moved and Cerny seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2017 - 01

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the Generations Bank of Exeter, the Heartland Bank of Geneva, Shickley, Grafton, and Fairmont, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan and the First Bank of Utica – Milligan branch, are hereby designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.





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Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS

Noel moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2017 - 02

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be authorized to invest the surplus funds of said county in United States Government Bonds, United States Treasury Notes, Bills or Certificates of Indebtedness maturing within two years of the date of purchase; and in Certificates of Deposit, or Money Market Savings Accounts.

Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

The Chairman declared the resolution adopted.

DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

Johnson moved and Sluka seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2017 - 03

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capital stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,





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NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2017, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$250,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

SECURITIES COMMITTEE

Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

AUTHORIZING BOARD CHAIRMAN AND COUNTY CLERK TO ACT ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD

RESOLUTION 2017 – 04



WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors meet the second and fourth Tuesday of every month;

WHEREAS, the salary of all county employees are paid every other week and the payments of such salaries must be approved prior to the issuance of such pay checks; and

WHEREAS, although the Board shall not hold regular meetings in between the second and fourth Tuesday of every month, the activities of County government shall continue and certain claims, warrants and payment of salaries must be acted upon every other week; and

WHEREAS, since the salaries of the employees of the County of Fillmore are paid every other week and the County Board must approve the payment of the wages of the county employees prior to the preparation and issuance of such payments which approval by the County Board is not possible in light of the fact that the County Board only meets on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month; and

WHEREAS, in order to pay the wages of the employees of the County of Fillmore every other Friday, it will be necessary for at least one member of the County Board and the County Clerk to approve the issuance of the payment of wages prior to the preparation and issuance of such paychecks irrespective of whether the approval is made on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103, the powers of the County as a body corporate and politic are exercised through the County Board; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FILLMORE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THAT, PURSUANT TO THE STATUTORY AUTHORITY OF THIS Board as set forth above, the Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors and the Fillmore County Clerk, in between the second and fourth Tuesday of every month, are hereby authorized to prepare claims and issue warrants for the following expenditures, as this Board has previously approved such expenditures through budget approval, approval of contracts, and related processes:

- 1. Payroll and associated expenses;
- 2. Utilities;
- 3. Lease payments;
- 4. Contract and/or other installment payments which have been contracted for or authorized by action of this Board;

The aforementioned individuals have no authority to conduct County business beyond that stated above. Payments pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 4 above of this Resolution may only be made in those instances when required by law or enforceable contractual obligations. Any other action may only be undertaken by the Board either in an Emergency Meeting, when such meeting has been called or convened pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §84-1411, or pursuant to a meeting convened by the County Clerk pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-154.

The above and foregoing Resolution was duly approved by a vote of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors at a public meeting duly held in accordance with applicable law on this 5th day of January, 2017 and shall remain enforceable until such Resolution has been revoked.

After review of the minutes and salary resolutions of the County Sheriff since August 2005 (when the Interlocal Agreement was signed with the City of Geneva) it was determined approximately \$3,500.00 additional was given to the Sheriff by the salary resolution for 2007 over the other elected officials. Included within that salary resolution and everyone since then it states that if the interlocal agreement with the City is dissolved that the salary for the County Sheriff will be 120% of the Assessor, Clerk, and Treasurer.

FILLMORE COUNTY HOSPITAL

Paul Utemark, CEO for Fillmore County Hospital and Debbie Hoarty, Chairperson for the Fillmore County Hospital Board were present for discussion regarding the financial state of the hospital as well as answer any questions the County Board had for them. They are in the process of hiring an interim CEO while Paul is out on medical leave. Paul informed the Board that there are a lot of changes with billing and reimbursements from Medicare and Medicaid.





March 14, 2017

The Board, Paul, and Debbie reviewed who owned the hospital and land. Fillmore County hospital is a separate subdivision/entity of Fillmore County. They have their own budget (outside of the Counties) and they are audited by a different firm, they have a Board of Directors that is appointed by the County Board. The hospital paid for the land but it is titled under the County. Patt Lentfer was present for discussion.

LAPTOP FOR EXTENSION OFFICE

Brandy VanDeWalle informed the Board that she would like to purchase a new laptop from UNL for the Extension office as they are on a three-year rotation.

GE CAPITAL LEASE FOR EQUIPMENT AT HOSPITAL

After discussion, Cerny moved and Mueller seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION #2017 – 11

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS (THE "COUNTY BOARD") OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA (THE "COUNTY"), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Chairperson and members of the County Board hereby find and determine: that the County owns and operates a hospital, including real and personal property, as provided in Section 23-3501, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, which is known as Fillmore County Hospital (the "Facility"); that it is necessary and advisable that the County acquire certain equipment for the Facility described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto (the "Equipment"); that pursuant to Section 23-3114, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, the County Board has the power and authority to enter into contracts for lease of real or personal property for authorized purposes; that such leases are not restricted to a single year and may provide for the purchase of property in installment payments; that the acquisition of the Equipment for the Facility is an authorized purpose; that pursuant to Section 23-3553, R.R.S. Neb. 2007, as amended, the Board of Trustees of the Hospital (the "Hospital Board") may establish depreciation funds (the "Fund") from patient or other revenue income for the purpose of purchasing equipment; that it is necessary and advisable for the County to provide for the financing of the Equipment over a period of years through the lease-purchase agreement with GE Government Finance, Inc., or an affiliate (the "Lessor") dated February 8, 2012 (the "2012 Agreement"), as amended pursuant to Section 2 below (the 2012 Agreement, as so amended, the "Agreement"); that it the understanding of this County Board that the Hospital Board has or will establish the Fund in amounts from time to time sufficient to satisfy the obligations of the County under the Agreement (although it is also understood that amounts on deposit in the Fund are not pledged for payment of amounts due under the Agreement and may be used for any lawful purpose, and any amounts on deposit in the Fund which are expected to be used to make payments under the agreement shall in no event exceed the amount permitted to be maintained in a "bona fide debt service fund" as defined in Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and related regulations); and that all conditions, acts and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to entering into the Agreement for acquisition of the Equipment by the County for the Facility do exist and have been done as required by law.

Section 2. The County is hereby authorized to amend the 2012 Agreement (as approved by the County Attorney and executed as provided in Section 3 below), as required to provide the payment of up to \$210,000.00 for the purchase price attributable to such Equipment to be payable in rental payments over a period of approximately five (5) years with interest (computed at a per annum rate not to exceed three and fifty-hundredths percent (3.5%)), as lease-purchase rentals. The Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit "B</u>, subject to the provisions of Section 3 below. It is hereby determined that the Agreement and the County's obligations thereunder shall be issued and delivered by the County to the Lessor as the County's lease-purchase obligation pursuant to and as described in Section 23-3114, R.R.S. Neb. 2007.

Section 3. The execution and delivery of the Agreement by the County is hereby authorized and approved by the County Board subject to the further approval by the County Attorney of Exhibit B and any attachments. Subject to the approval of Exhibit B by the County Attorney, the Chairperson of the County Board and County Clerk of the County are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver on behalf of the County said Agreement, including necessary counterparts, in substantially the form and content as presented to this meeting, but with such changes or modifications therein as to them seem necessary, desirable or appropriate for and on behalf of the County and subject to the approval of the County Attorney.



Section 4. That the Treasurer of the County is hereby appointed as registrar for the Agreement and shall keep books and records for such registration at the offices of the County in accordance with the terms of the Agreement.

Section 5. That the County Board hereby states that it is the intention of the County that the amount of basic rent due under said Agreement attributable to interest under the Agreement shall be excludable from the gross income of the registered owner thereof under the Federal Income Tax by virtue of Section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and sections related thereto, and the Chairperson of the County Board, County Clerk and County Treasurer each are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary and appropriate to carry out said intention.

Section 6. Subject to the approval of the final form of the Agreement by County Attorney and execution thereof as provided in Section 3 above, the County Board hereby agrees, in accordance with the terms of the Agreement, that it shall make appropriations for payment of rental payment under the Agreement, as provided to and subject to the terms of the Agreement, for the purpose of paying and sufficient to make all payments under the Agreement as and when such payments become due according to the terms thereof. It is the understanding of the County that the source of funds for such appropriations will be the Fund established by the Hospital Board or such other funds as may be made available by the Hospital. The County further covenants and agrees that it will during the term of such agreement observe and comply with the terms of the Agreement in such manner that a monies shall be lawfully available to pay all rentals due under said Agreement.

Section 7. That all actions previously taken by the County Board in connection with ordering the Equipment subject to said Agreement (as approved by the County Attorney and executed as provided in Section 3 above) for any items of such equipment be and they are hereby confirmed and ratified in all respects.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA TO DECLARE ITS OFFICIAL INTENT UNDER THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, TO REIMBURSE CERTAIN CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAX-EXEMPT OR TAX-FAVORED DEBT OBLIGATIONS

WHEREAS, the United States Department of the Treasury has promulgated final regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), that impose requirements on the County of Fillmore, Nebraska (the "Issuer") when it desires to reimburse itself for capital expenditures relating to the capital projects described herein from the proceeds of its tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations or such debt obligations issued on its behalf; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer has determined that it is necessary for the Issuer to construct, improve, equip and furnish certain of its facilities for use by the Issuer, including a maintenance facility and its courthouse (collectively, the "Project") and





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to finance the costs of such Project with the proceeds of tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations to be issued by the Issuer or by an entity authorized to issue such obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer anticipates that the Issuer will spend its moneys to pay Project costs (the "Prior Capital Expenditures") prior to the issuance of any tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer reasonably expects to be reimbursed for such Prior Capital Expenditures with proceeds of taxexempt or tax-favored debt obligations to be issued by the Issuer or by an entity authorized to issue such obligations (the "Reimbursement Debt") in the maximum principal amount of \$1,500,000 plus such additional principal amount necessary to pay costs of issuance and to fund any reserves; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer expects that the Reimbursement Debt will be incurred and allocated to reimburse the Prior Capital Expenditures no later than 18 months after the later of (a) the date on which it pays the Prior Capital Expenditures, or (b) the date on which the Project is placed in service, but in no event not later than 3 years after the original date of such Prior Capital Expenditures, or (c) such other date that is permitted by law; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer finds it necessary to adopt this resolution to ensure that its declaration of intent to reimburse itself for such Prior Capital Expenditures satisfies the "Official Intent Requirement" described in Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 (the "Regulations").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Issuer hereby declares its official intent to reimburse itself for the Prior Capital Expenditures relating to the Project out of the proceeds of the Reimbursement Debt to be issued by the Issuer or by an entity authorized to issue such obligations on its behalf. With such declaration, the Issuer hereby satisfies the "Official Intent Requirement" of the Regulations.

Section 2. Other than (a) expenditures to be paid or reimbursed from sources other than the Reimbursement Debt, (b) expenditures constituting "preliminary expenditures" within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations or (c) expenditures in a "de minimus" amount (as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(1) of the Regulations), no expenditures for the Project have been paid by the Issuer more than 60 days prior to the date of execution and delivery of this Resolution.

Section 3. This resolution does not constitute approval of any kind with respect to the issuance of the Reimbursement Debt or any other tax-exempt or tax-favored debt obligations and does not legally or morally obligate the Issuer or any other entity to issue such obligations on its behalf.

Section 4. This resolution shall be operative, effective and valid upon its passage by the Issuer's Board of Supervisors.

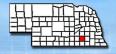

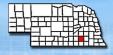
