Reorganization Meeting

The Fillmore County Board of Supervisors convened to reorganize, as required by statute, in open and public session at 9:40 a.m. on January 3, 2019, in the Courthouse Boardroom in Geneva, Nebraska. Members present were Noel, Sluka, Graham, Cerny, Harre, Neiman, and Lightwine. The County Clerk was present to record the minutes of the meeting.

Notice of the meeting was given by publication. A copy of the publication is on file in the County Clerk's office. All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public. Agenda was approved as presented. The Chairman noted that the public meeting guidelines are posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested. The reorganization meeting adjourned at 10:30 a.m.

NOMINATIONS OF CHAIRMAN

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman for the year 2019. County Clerk called for nominations for Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors. Cerny nominated Neiman and Lightwine seconded the nomination. With no other nominations, Sluka moved and Graham seconded that nominations cease.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors that the Generations Bank of Exeter, the Heartland Bank of Geneva, Shickley, Grafton, and Fairmont, the York State Bank of York and Geneva, the Cornerstone Bank of York and Geneva, the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Milligan and the First Bank of Utica – Milligan branch, are hereby designated as bank depositories and the Fillmore County Treasurer is hereby authorized to deposit funds of the County that may come into her possession into these said depositories.

WHEREAS, the County of Fillmore on a regular basis does business with Geneva Tire;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska does hereby approve the purchase of merchandise and material from Ralph Graham doing business as Geneva Tire, and the sale by Ralph Graham of merchandise and material to the County of Fillmore on a per invoice basis in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00, without the prior approval by virtue of a resolution passed by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska does hereby approve the purchase of merchandise and material from Kenny Harre doing business as Highway 41 Express, and the sale by Kenny Harre of merchandise and material to the County of Fillmore on a per invoice basis in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00, without the prior approval by virtue of a resolution passed by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska;

AUTHORIZING BOARD CHAIRMAN AND COUNTY CLERK TO ACT ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD

Harre moved and Sluka seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2019 - 05

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors meet the second and fourth Tuesday of every month;

WHEREAS, the salary of all county employees are paid every other week and the payments of such salaries must be approved prior to the issuance of such pay checks; and





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WHEREAS, although the Board shall not hold regular meetings in between the second and fourth Tuesday of every month, the activities of County government shall continue and certain claims, warrants and payment of salaries must be acted upon every other week; and

WHEREAS, since the salaries of the employees of the County of Fillmore are paid every other week and the County Board must approve the payment of the wages of the county employees prior to the preparation and issuance of such payments which approval by the County Board is not possible in light of the fact that the County Board only meets on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month; and

WHEREAS, in order to pay the wages of the employees of the County of Fillmore every other Friday, it will be necessary for at least one member of the County Board and the County Clerk to approve the issuance of the payment of wages prior to the preparation and issuance of such paychecks irrespective of whether the approval is made on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103, the powers of the County as a body corporate and politic are exercised through the County Board; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FILLMORE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THAT, PURSUANT TO THE STATUTORY AUTHORITY OF THIS Board as set forth above, the Chairman of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors and the Fillmore County Clerk, in between the second and fourth Tuesday of every month, are hereby authorized to prepare claims and issue warrants for the following expenditures, as this Board has previously approved such expenditures through budget approval, approval of contracts, and related processes:

- 1. Payroll and associated expenses;
- 2. Utilities;
- 3. Lease payments:
- 4. Contract and/or other installment payments which have been contracted for or authorized by action of this Board;

The aforementioned individuals have no authority to conduct County business beyond that stated above. Payments pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 4 above of this Resolution may only be made in those instances when required by law or enforceable contractual obligations. Any other action may only be undertaken by the Board either in an Emergency Meeting, when such meeting has been called or convened pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §84-1411, or pursuant to a meeting convened by the County Clerk pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-154.

The above and foregoing Resolution was duly approved by a vote of the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors at a public meeting duly held in accordance with applicable law on this 3rd day of January, 2019 and shall remain enforceable until such Resolution has been revoked.

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DEPOSIT OF SURPLUS FUNDS

Sluka moved and Graham seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2019 - 06

WHEREAS, Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, provides among other things that when County funds exceed 50% of the said capital of all banks of the County, then the Treasurer, with the consent of the County Board, may deposit an amount in excess thereof, but not exceeding capital in any one bank, and

WHEREAS, the County Board has by resolution informed the County Treasurer of Fillmore County that all of the banks in Fillmore County have been designated as depositories for monies that the County Treasurer may have in her possession, and

WHEREAS, under provisions of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, the County Treasurer shall not have a preference to any one of the banks in which she may so deposit. The County Treasurer may select one or more banks to be used for active accounts in which she may keep deposited in excess of these requirements only such funds as may be necessary for the transaction of ordinary day-to-day requirements.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of Section 77-2314, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, capital shall mean capital stock, surpluses, undivided profits, capital notes or debentures, and other unimpaired reserves, and

WHEREAS, paid up capital at Fillmore County Banks is as follows:

WHEREAS, from time to time, the County Treasurer has on hand and will have on hand for deposit, County money that should be deposited for safekeeping in excess of the amount permitted under the statute,

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that the County Treasurer of Fillmore County be and hereby is, authorized to deposit in the aforesaid banks in Fillmore County during 2019, County funds in her possession in a sum equal to but not in excess of the said capital of said banks, provided that said depository bank or banks shall secure said deposits by pledges of the assets of said bank as provided in Section 77-2318, Revised Statutes of Nebraska, but shall not at any one time have in said bank County funds in excess of 90% of the bonds deposited by said bank as security plus the \$250,000.00 covered and protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Bonds shall be required of all banks and capital stock financial institutions for such excess deposit unless security is given in accordance with Section 77-2318.01, Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

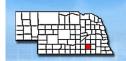

RESOLUTION 2019 - 07

WHEREAS, the Fillmore County Board directed the County Highway Superintendent, by resolution, to study the use being made of the West ½ mile of the public road located BETWEEN Section 3, T8N, R1W, Exeter Township, Fillmore County Nebraska and Section 34, T9N, R1W, York County. Nebraska.

WHEREAS, the Fillmore County Highway Superintendent has reported in writing the results of such study and has recommended the vacation and abandonment of said road, and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of said report the Fillmore County Board adopted a resolution fixing the time for a public hearing at 9:45 a.m., January 8, 2019 in the boardroom of the Fillmore County Courthouse in Geneva, Nebraska, Fillmore County, and

WHEREAS, a copy of the said hearing notice was published once a week for three consecutive weeks in The Nebraska Signal and in the York News-Times, the legal newspapers of general circulation in Fillmore County and York County, Nebraska, a proof thereof is now on file in the County Clerk's office of said County, and

WHEREAS, the hearing was held on January 8, 2019 at 9:45 a.m. in the boardroom of the Fillmore County Courthouse in Geneva, Nebraska, Fillmore County. Upon request of Exeter-Fairmont Township and no person appeared to oppose the closing or abandonment of said roads, nor was there any written testimony received against closing or abandonment of said roads.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska, pursuant to Section 39-1725, R. S. of Nebraska, 1943 as amended, that the following two tracts of roadway, be and the same hereby is closed, vacated, and abandoned from this date, and that the right-of-way of said roads shall be reverted to the owners of the land abutting thereon to the center of the road:

Tract 1:

WHEREAS, the County Board finds that the most appropriate way to work on said regulations is without the possibility of new applications coming forward during a time frame which allows consideration of appropriate wind energy conversion regulations.

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the foregoing statement, the County Board of Fillmore County, Nebraska, hereby adopts the following resolution:

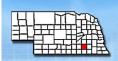

Shadow flicker impact analysis will be provided by a 3rd party, at the applicant's expense.

GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2019, IN THE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$12,000,000.00

Brad Slaughter, Senior Vice President with Piper Jaffray informed the Board that the USDA bonds could be refinanced with a savings over a million dollars. Brad met with the Hospital Board and they were in favor of refinancing. Stephanie Jacobsen, Director of Finance with Fillmore County Hospital was present for discussion.

After discussion, Cerny moved and Lightwine seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION #2019 - 37

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA, THAT:

Section 1. The Chairperson and Board of Supervisors hereby find and determine the following:

- (a) There have been heretofore issued and are now outstanding and unpaid valid interest-bearing General Obligation Hospital Bond, Series 2010A-1 (USDA Direct Loan), in the outstanding principal amount of \$8,153,537, dated May 30, 2012, General Obligation Hospital Bond, Series 2010A-2 (USDA Direct Loan), in the outstanding principal amount of \$1,621,635, dated May 30, 2012, and Taxable General Obligation Hospital Bond, Series 2010B (USDA Direct Loan), in the outstanding principal amount of \$1,639,763, dated May 30, 2012 (collectively, the "Outstanding Bonds"), such Outstanding Bonds being issued in the original aggregate principal amount of \$12,600,000 as a direct loan with the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to a resolution duly passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors, and such Outstanding Bonds are redeemable at the option of the County at any time at a redemption price equal to the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption;
- (b) The Outstanding Bonds are valid, interest bearing obligations of the County; (i) since the Outstanding Bonds were issued, the rates of interest available in the market have so declined that by issuing its refunding bonds to provide funds for the payment and redemption of a portion of the Outstanding Bonds, all as set out above, a substantial savings in the amount of yearly running interest will be made to the County; (ii) all or a portion of the Outstanding Bonds (as called for redemption, collectively, the "Refunded Bonds") are herein authorized to be called for redemption on a date or dates (each a "Redemption Date") to be determined in a direction for call; (iii) for the purpose of providing for the payment and redemption of the Refunded Bonds as above set out and to pay costs of issuance thereof, it is in the best interest of the County to issue general obligation refunding bonds of the County in the aggregate stated principal amount of not to exceed \$12,000,000; (iv) except as set forth herein, the County has no bond sinking funds on hand for the retirement of the Refunded Bonds not required for the timely payment of principal and interest due on the Redemption Date; (v) all conditions exist for the issuance of bonds in the amount of not to exceed \$12,000,000 pursuant to Sections 10-142, R.R.S. Neb. 2012 and 66-4,101, R.R.S. Neb. 2018, as amended.

Section 2.

- (a) For the purpose of refunding the Refunded Bonds and paying the costs of issuing bonds as described herein, there shall be and there are hereby ordered issued the negotiable bonds of this County to be designated as "General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2019" in the aggregate stated principal amount of not to exceed Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000) (the "Bonds").
- (b) The Bonds or any portion thereof are hereby authorized to be sold pursuant to a negotiated sale. In connection with such sale, the Chairperson and County Clerk (each, an "Authorized Officer") are hereby authorized to specify, determine, designate, establish and appoint, as the case may be, in a written designation which may be included in a bond purchase agreement or other certificate, as applicable (each, a "Designation"), (i) the firm to serve as underwriter and initial purchaser of the bonds (the "Underwriter"), (ii) the aggregate purchase price of the Bonds and the underwriting discount, which underwriting discount shall not exceed 1.45% of the aggregate stated principal amount of the Bonds, (iii) the title, dated date, aggregate principal amount (including the aggregate principal amounts of serial Bonds and term Bonds, if any), which aggregate stated principal amount shall not exceed \$12,000,000, and the final maturity date, which shall not be later than December 15, 2052, (iv) the principal amounts maturing in each year, (v) the rate or rates of interest to be borne by each principal maturity, provided that the County realize present value savings as a result of issuing the Bonds to refund the Refunded Bonds, (vi) the principal payment dates and interest payment dates, (vii) whether the Bonds will be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturity, and if subject to such optional redemption, the provisions governing such redemption, including a redemption price not to exceed 104% of the principal amount then being redeemed plus accrued interest to the date of redemption, (viii) the amount and due date of each sinking fund installment for any of the Bonds issued as term Bonds, (ix) the designation of the Paying Agent and Registrar and the form and content of any agreement between the County and such entity and (x) all other terms and provisions of the Bonds not otherwise specified or fixed by this Resolution.





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(c) Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to irrevocably call any or all of the Outstanding Bonds for redemption on the Redemption Date he or she determines appropriate. Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to designate, approve, execute and deliver, as the case may be, the form, content, terms and provisions of any published and/or mailed notice of redemption with respect to the payment and redemption of the Refunded Bonds, and direct the application of such proceeds and any investment income to the payment of all of the principal of and interest on the Refunded Bonds maturing on or before each respective Redemption Date and the application of the balance of such proceeds and any investment income thereof to the redemption and retirement of the Refunded Bonds on the Redemption Date.

(d) The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof. The date of original issue for the Bonds shall be the date of delivery thereof. Interest on the Bonds, at the respective rates for each maturity, shall be payable semiannually on such dates as may be determined in the Designation, each of said dates an "Interest Payment Date"), and the Bonds shall bear such interest from the date of original issue or the most recent Interest Payment Date, whichever is later. The interest due on each Interest Payment Date shall be payable to the registered owners of record as of the close of business on the fifteenth day immediately preceding the Interest Payment Date (the "Record Date"), subject to the provisions of Section 4 hereof. The Bonds shall be numbered from 1 upwards in the order of their issuance. No Bond shall be issued originally or upon transfer or partial redemption having more than one principal maturity. The initial bond numbering and principal amounts for each of the Bonds issued shall be designated by the County's Treasurer as directed by the initial purchaser thereof. Payments of interest due on the Bonds prior to maturity or earlier redemption shall be made by the Paying Agent and Registrar, as designated pursuant to Section 3 hereof, by mailing a check or draft in the amount due for such interest on each Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Bond, as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date, to such owner's registered address as shown on the books of registration as required to be maintained in Section 3 hereof. Payments of principal and interest accrued thereon due at maturity or at any date fixed for redemption prior to maturity shall be made by said Paying Agent and Registrar to the registered owners upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds to said Paying Agent and Registrar. The County and said Paying Agent and Registrar may treat the registered owner of any Bond as the absolute owner of such Bond for the purpose of making payments thereon and for all other purposes and neither the County nor the Paying Agent and Registrar shall be affected by any notice or knowledge to the contrary, whether such Bond or any installment of interest due thereon shall be overdue or not. All payments on account of interest or principal made to the registered owner of any Bond in accordance with the terms of this resolution shall be valid and effectual and shall be a discharge of the County and said Paying Agent and Registrar, in respect of the liability upon the Bonds or claims for interest to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

Section 3. A bank or trust company may be appointed by an Authorized Officer to serve as the Paying Agent and Registrar for the Bonds and such appointment may be made in the Designation or such other documentation determined appropriate in connection with issuance of the Bonds. In the event of an appointment of such bank or trust company as Paying Agent and Registrar, said Paying Agent and Registrar shall serve in such capacities under the terms of an agreement entitled "Paying Agent and Registrar's Agreement" between the County and said Paying Agent and Registrar. The Chairperson and County Clerk are hereby authorized to approve, execute and deliver said agreement on behalf of the County as such officers shall deem appropriate on behalf of the County. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall keep and maintain for the County books for the registration and transfer of the Bonds at its designated corporate trust office. The names and registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the Bonds shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any Bond may be transferred pursuant to its provisions at the designated corporate trust office of said Paying Agent and Registrar by surrender of such Bond for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to said Paying Agent and Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by said owner's duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Paying Agent and Registrar on behalf of the County will register such transfer upon said registration books and deliver to the transferee registered owner or owners (or send by registered mail to the transferee owner or owners thereof at such transferee owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of such transferee owner or owners, a new Bond or Bonds of the same interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the Bonds by this resolution, one Bond may be transferred for several such Bonds of the same interest rate and maturity, and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such Bonds may be transferred for one or several such Bonds, respectively, of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a Bond, the surrendered Bond shall be cancelled and destroyed. All Bonds issued upon transfer of the Bonds so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the County evidencing the same obligations as the Bonds surrendered and shall be entitled to all the benefits and protection of this resolution to the same extent as the Bonds upon transfer of which they were delivered. The County and said Paying Agent and Registrar shall not be required to transfer any Bond during any period from any Record Date until its





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immediately following Interest Payment Date or to transfer any Bond called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.

Section 4. In the event that payments of interest due on the Bonds on an Interest Payment Date are not timely made, such interest shall cease to be payable to the registered owners as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date and shall be payable to the registered owners of the Bonds as of a special date of record for payment of such defaulted interest as shall be designated by the Paying Agent and Registrar whenever monies for the purpose of paying such defaulted interest become available.

Section 5. If the date for payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds shall be a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or a day on which banking institutions in the city in which the designated corporate trust office of the Paying Agent and Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive order to close, then the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or a day on which such banking institutions are authorized to close, and payment on such day shall have the same force and effect as if made on the nominal date of payment.

Section 6. Bonds shall be subject to redemption, in whole or in part, prior to maturity at any time on or after the fifth anniversary of the date of original issue thereof (or such other date as determined in the Designation), at par plus accrued interest on the principal amount redeemed to the date fixed for redemption. The County may select the Bonds to be redeemed for optional redemption in its sole discretion. The Bonds shall be redeemed only in amounts of \$5,000 or integral multiples thereof. Bonds redeemed in part only shall be surrendered to the Paying Agent and Registrar in exchange for new Bonds evidencing the unredeemed principal thereof. Notice of redemption of any Bond called for redemption shall be given, at the direction of the County by said Paying Agent and Registrar by mail not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption, first class, postage prepaid, sent to the registered owner of such Bond at said owner's registered address. Such notice shall designate the Bond or Bonds to be redeemed by maturity or otherwise, the date of original issue and the date fixed for redemption and shall state that such Bond or Bonds are to be presented for prepayment at the office of said Paying Agent and Registrar. In case of any Bond partially redeemed, such notice shall specify the portion of the principal amount of such Bond to be redeemed. No defect in the mailing of notice for any Bond shall affect the sufficiency of the proceedings of the County designating the Bonds called for redemption or the effectiveness of such call for Bonds for which notice by mail has been properly given and the County shall have the right to direct further notice of redemption for any such Bond for which defective notice has been given.

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in any sinking fund for the Bonds, which would cause the Bonds to be arbitrage bonds within the meaning of Sections 103(b) and 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and further covenants to comply with said Sections 103(b) and 148 and all applicable regulations thereunder throughout the term of said bond issue. The County hereby covenants and agrees to take all actions necessary under the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest payable on those Bonds issued with tax-exempt interest.

Section 15. CHANGES TO SECTION 9.16 – COMMERCIAL/UTILITY GRADE WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS IN THE ZONING REGULATIONS

Ron Schropfer, Scott Vonderfecht, Becky Vonderfecht, Robert Schropfer, Galen Niederklein, Sondra L. Backstrom, Greg Scellin, and Gorlyn Nun were present for the discussion.

After a lengthy discussion, Neiman moved and Lightwine seconded the introduction of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION #2019 - 38

A RESOLUTION AMANEDING THE FILLMORE COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE UPDATES REGULATIONS FOR THE COMMERCIAL/UTILITY GRADE WIND ENERGY SYSTSEM REGULATIONS; AND TO PROVIDE WHEN THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 23-174.10, as amended, any county which has adopted a county zoning regulation may make such regulations as may be necessary or expedient to promote the public health, safety, and welfare; and





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WHEREAS, Fillmore County has adopted zoning regulations and the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors desires to update the Commercial/Utility Wind Energy System regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Fillmore County Joint Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on October 21, 2019 and provided a recommendation of approval, and the Fillmore County Board of Supervisors conducted a public hearing on October 22, 2019 for the following regulations and amendments to the Fillmore County Zoning Regulations:

9.16 COMMERCIAL/UTILITY GRADE WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS

- 9.16.01 PURPOSE: It is the purpose of this regulation to promote the safe, effective and efficient use of commercial/utility grade wind energy conversion systems within Fillmore County.
- 9.16.02 DEFINITIONS: The following are defined for the specific use of this section.

AGGREGATE PROJECT shall mean projects that are developed and operated in a coordinated fashion, but which have multiple entities separately owning one or more of the individual WECS within the larger project. Associated infrastructure such as power lines and transformers that service the facility may be owned by a separate entity but are also part of the aggregated project.

COMMERCIAL WECS shall mean a wind energy conversion system of equal to or greater than 100 kW in total name plate generating capacity.

HUB HEIGHT shall mean the distance from ground level as measured to the centerline of the rotor.

FALL ZONE shall mean the area, defined as the furthest distance from the tower base, in which a guyed or tubular tower will collapse in the event of a structural failure. This area may be less than the total height of the structure.

FEEDER LINE shall mean any power line that carries electrical power from one or more wind turbines to the point of interconnection with the project distribution system, in the case of interconnection with the high voltage transmission systems the point of interconnection shall be the substation serving the wind energy conversion system.

METEOROLOGICAL TOWER shall mean, for purposes of this regulation, a tower which is erected primarily to measure wind speed and directions plus other data relevant to siting a Wind Energy Conversion System. Meteorological towers do not include towers and equipment used by airports, the Nebraska Department of Roads, or other applications to monitor weather conditions.

PROPERTY LINE shall mean the boundary line of the area over which the entity applying for a Wind Energy Conversion System permit has legal control for the purpose of installing, maintaining and operating a Wind Energy Conversion System.

PUBLIC CONSERVATION LANDS shall mean land owned in fee title by State or Federal agencies and managed specifically for conservation purposes, including but not limited to State Wildlife Management Areas, State Parks, federal Wildlife Refuges and Waterfowl Production Areas. For purposes of this regulation, public conservation lands will also include lands owned in fee title by non-profit conservation organizations, Public conservation lands will also include private lands upon which conservation easements have been sold to public agencies or non-profit conservation organizations.

ROTOR DIAMETER shall mean the diameter of the circle described by the moving rotor blades.

SMALL WIND ENERGY SYSTEM shall mean a wind energy conversion system consisting of a wind turbine, a tower, and associated control or conversion electronics, which has a rated capacity of not more than 100 kW and which is intended to primarily reduce on-site consumption of utility power.

SUBSTATIONS shall mean any electrical facility to convert electricity produced by wind turbines to a higher voltage for interconnection with high voltage transmission lines.

TOTAL HEIGHT shall mean the highest point, above ground level, reached by a rotor tip or any other part of the Wind Energy Conversion System.

TOWER shall mean the vertical structures, including the foundation, that support the electrical generator, rotor blades, or meteorological equipment.

TOWER HEIGHT shall mean the total height of the Wind Energy Conversion System exclusive of the rotor blades.

TRANSMISSION LINE shall mean the electrical power lines that carry voltages of at least 69,000 volts (69 KV) and are primarily used to carry electric energy over medium to long distances rather than directly interconnecting and supplying electric energy to retail customers.

WIND ENERGY CONVERSION SYSTEM (WECS) shall mean an electrical generating facility comprised of one or more wind turbines and accessory facilities, including but not limited to: power lines, transformers, substations





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and meteorological towers that operate by converting the kinetic energy of wind into electrical energy. The energy may be used on-site or distributed into the electrical grid.

WIND TURBINES shall mean any piece of electrical generating equipment that converts the kinetic energy of blowing wind into electrical energy using airfoils or similar devices to capture the wind.

9.16.03 REQUIREMENTS: Commercial/Utility Grade Wind Energy Systems may be permitted as a Conditional Use within any district where the use is listed and allowed. The following minimum requirements and information shall be met and supplied:

- 1. The name(s) of project applicant.
- 2. The name of the project owner.
- 3. The legal description and address of the project.
- 4. A description of the project of the project including: Number, type, name plate generating capacity, tower height, rotor diameter, and total height of all wind turbines and means of interconnecting with the electrical grid.
- 5. Site layout, including the location of property lines, wind turbines, feeder lines, and all related accessory structures. This site layout shall include distances and be drawn to scale.
- 6. Certification by an Engineer competent in disciplines of WEC's.
- 7. Documentation of land ownership or legal control of the property.
- 8. The latitude and longitude of individual wind turbines; included with this shall be an area or zone in close proximity that meets all setbacks; where actual WEC will be considered.
- 9. A USGS topographical map, or map with similar data, of the property and surrounding area, including any other Wind Energy Conversion System, within 10 rotor distances of the proposed Wind Energy Conversion System not owned by the applicant.
- 10. Location of wetlands, scenic, and natural areas (including bluffs) within 1,320 feet of the proposed Wind Energy Conversion System.
- 11. An Acoustical Analysis that certifies that the noise requirements within this regulation can be met
- 12. The applicant shall supply the emergency management agency and/or fire departments with a basic emergency response plan.
- 13. FAA and FCC permit, if necessary. Applicant shall submit permit or evidence that the permit has been filed with the appropriate agency.

9.16.04 AGGREGATED PROJECTS:

- Aggregated projects may jointly submit a single application and be reviewed under joint proceedings, including notices, public hearings, reviews and as appropriate approvals.
- Permits may be issued and recorded separately.
- 3. Joint projects will be assessed fees as one project.

9.16.05 SETBACKS:

All towers shall adhere to the setbacks (measured from the edge of the tower) established in the following table:

- * The setback for dwelling units shall be reciprocal in that no dwelling unit shall be constructed within the same distance required for a commercial/utility Wind Energy Conversion System.
- ** The setback shall be measured from any future Rights-of-Way if a planned change or expanded Right-of-Way is known. Such rights-of-way shall be verified with the Nebraska Department of Roads and County Roads Department.
- *** Setback may be reduced to a distance of no less than 100 feet based on review of proposed distance and approval by Nebraska Game & Parks Commission, U.S. Fish and Wildlife, and Army Corps of Engineers. Such reduction shall not be less than 100 feet and be based on certified engineer reports showing no effects on the identified areas. Applicant shall submit report and approval or evidence that the study has been performed and the request for approval has been submitted to the appropriate agency prior to the issuance of a zoning permit. Such permit would be conditional and contingent upon such approval.

9.16.06 SPECIAL SAFETY AND DESIGN STANDARDS: All towers shall adhere to the following safety and design standards:

- 1. Clearance of rotor blades or airfoils must maintain a minimum of 12 feet of clearance between their lowest point and the ground.
- 2. All Commercial/Utility WECS shall have a sign or signs posted on the tower, transformer and substation, warning of high voltage. Other signs shall be posted on the turbine with emergency contact information.
- 3. All wind turbines, which are a part of a commercial/utility WECS, shall be installed with a tubular, monopole type tower.
- 4. Height: The total height shall be determined by the fall zone requirement <u>and shall not exceed six hundred (600)</u> <u>feet. Total height shall not exceed 600 feet.</u> FAA approval is required.
- 5. Consideration shall be given to painted aviation warnings on all towers more than 200 feet.
- Color and finish: All wind turbines and towers that are part of a commercial/utility WECS shall be white, grey, or another non-obtrusive color. Blades may be black in order to facilitate deicing. Finishes shall be matte or nonreflective.
- 7. Lighting: Lighting, including lighting intensity and frequency of strobe, shall adhere to but not exceed requirements established by the FAA permits and regulations. Red strobe lights shall be used during nighttime illumination to reduce impacts on neighboring uses and migratory birds. Red pulsating incandescent lights should be avoided.
- 8. Other signage: All other signage shall comply with the sign regulations found in these regulations.
- 9. Feeder Lines: All communications and feeder lines associated with the project distribution system installed as part of a WECS shall be buried, where physically feasible. Where obstacles to the buried lines create a need to go above ground, these lines may be placed above ground only to miss the obstacle. All distribution and/or transmission lines outside of the project distribution system may be above ground.
- 10. Waste Disposal: Solid and Hazardous wastes, including but not limited to crates, packaging materials, damaged or worn parts, as well as used oils and lubricants, shall be removed from the site promptly and disposed of in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal regulations.
- 11. Discontinuation and Decommissioning:





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- a. A WECS shall be considered a discontinued use after one year without energy production, unless a plan is developed and submitted to the Zoning Administrator outlining the steps and schedule for returning the WECS to service. All WECS and accessory facilities shall be removed to four feet below ground level within 180 days of the discontinuation of use. The 180 days may be extended if proof of weather delays is provided.
- b. Each Commercial/Utility WECS shall have a Decommissioning plan outlining the anticipated means and cost of removing WECS at the end of their serviceable life or upon being discontinued use. The cost estimates shall be made by a competent party; such as a Professional Engineer, a contractor capable of decommissioning or a person with suitable expertise or experience with decommissioning. The plan shall also identify the financial resources that will be available to pay for decommissioning and removal of the WECS and accessory facilities.
- 12. Noise: No Commercial/Utility WECS shall exceed 50 dBA at the nearest structure or use occupied by humans. Such structures or uses include dwelling units, churches, daycares, and the like, but do not include barns, sheds, or agricultural, commercial or industrial uses.
- 13. Interference: The applicant shall minimize or mitigate interference with any commercial or public safety electromagnetic communications, such as radio, telephone, microwaves, or television signals caused by any WECS. The applicant shall notify all communication tower operators within five miles of the proposed WECS location upon application to the county for permits.
- 14. Roads: Applicants shall:
 - a. Identify all county, municipal or township roads to be used for the purpose of transporting WECS, substation parts, cement, and/or equipment for construction, operation or maintenance of the WECS and obtain applicable weight and size permits from the impacted jurisdictions prior to construction.
 - b. Conduct a pre-construction survey, in coordination with the appropriate jurisdictions to determine existing road conditions. The survey shall include photographs and a written agreement to document the condition of the public road.
 - c. Be responsible for restoring the road(s) and bridges to preconstruction conditions.
 - d. Roads agreements must be approved before any construction can begin.
- 15. Drainage System: The applicant shall be responsible for immediate repair of damage to public drainage systems stemming from construction, operation or maintenance of the WECS.
- 16. <u>Shadow Flicker: Applicant will represent that the flicker impact on any occupied resident or community building will not exceed 30 hours per year and will provide a mitigation plan in the case this tolerance is exceeded. Shadow flicker impact analysis will be provided by a 3rd party, at the applicant's expense.</u>
- 17. Post Construction as-built survey, provided by a 3rd party, at the applicant's expense.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of Supervisors of Fillmore County, Nebraska that the above regulations pertaining to the Commercial/Utility Grade Wind Energy Systems are hereby approved.

FURTHER IT BE IT RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication or posting required by law and all other resolutions and sections in conflict are hereby repealed.

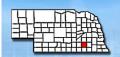

WHEREAS, the likelihood of solar energy farms in Fillmore County is propbable, the County Board desires to implement regulations which are appropriate for the county and its residents, and

WHEREAS, the Fillmore County Planning Commission should be directed to review the County Comprehensive Planning and Zoning Regulations with recommendations for changes to the comperhensive plan and to the County Zoning Regulations dealing with solar energy farms before granting or recommending a conditional use permit for the construction of any solar energy farm; and

WHEREAS, the County Board finds that the most appropriate way to work on said regulations is without the possibility of new applications coming forward during a time frame which allows consideration of appropriate solar energy farms.

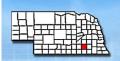
