Chairman Neiman announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted on the wall in the Board of Supervisors room.

MINUTES APPROVED

Chairman of the Board, Neiman declared the minutes from the March 25, 2025, meeting approved as presented.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Supervisor Sluka informed the Board that he was contacted by the Company that was proposing a new wind turbine project in the Glengary Township area that they are putting this project on hold for the time being.

DISCUSSION WITH THE CITY OF GENEVA REGARDING BULLPENS

Joe Casey and Kyle Svec with the City of Geneva were present for discussion regarding the bullpens. Joe reported that the City Council approved the purchase of crushed rock/fines on a portion of the East bullpen to see how this works.
